

Smallest vs. Largest Classes



Projection Factors


- Birthrate Continued Decline in Kindergarteners

Elementary Schools Potential **10%+ Declines** Through 2026-27 (by Attendance Area)




Fourteen Schools Declining by 10%+; Six Schools Declining Between 3% and 9%; only Two Schools Growing (TC (+7%) and GB (+6%))

Middle Schools Potential **10%+ Declines**Through 2026-27 (by Attendance Area)



Five out of Eight Middle Schools Declining; One Flat (LC); Two Up Slightly (IH and CW)
