Welcome to the San Ramon Valley Unified School District Board of Education meeting. Your interest in our schools is greatly appreciated.

The Board Members value input from the community. Members of the public can address the Board at meetings regarding items that are not on the agenda during the agenda item *Public Comment for Non-Agendized Items*. Items that are on the agenda can be addressed when that item is introduced by the Board President.

In order to ensure that the Board has adequate time to hear from the public while balancing the need to conduct its agendized work, public comment will be handled in the following way:

- A time limit of three (3) minutes per speaker has been established and will be enforced. The Board reserves the right to decrease the amount of time allotted per speaker. All speakers will be allotted an equal amount of time.
- Comments for special meetings and workshops will be limited to the agenda item only

**Public Comment for both Agendized and Non-Agendized Items:**

- Anyone who wishes to address the Board must submit a Speaker Card to Cindy Fischer
- The Board President will call each speaker to the podium during the appropriate agenda item
- Please note that, by law, the Board cannot take action or engage in dialogue on items not on the agenda.

**For Items Not on the Agenda:**

- A maximum of thirty minutes will be allotted for the agenda item: *Public Comment for Non-Agendized items*
- If the amount of time needed for all speakers to be heard exceeds the thirty minutes allotted, then *Public Comment for Non-Agendized Items* will be paused at the thirty minute mark and will be continued prior to agenda item: *Administrative Matters* until all remaining speakers whose cards were submitted before the pause have had an opportunity to be heard
- When there is a topic that only one speaker wishes to address, that speaker will be prioritized
- We strongly encourage speakers who wish to speak about the same topic to designate one or two individuals to speak on behalf of the entire group
- If there are many people who share a unified view of a topic, they may raise their hand or stand while the designated speakers are addressing the Board so that the Board Members are aware of the level of support

By law, board members can only discuss items that appear on the agenda. For this reason, board members do not engage in dialogue with individuals speaking during the non-agenda public comment section of the meeting. For individuals who wish to speak with board members in depth about an issue, contacting board members on an individual basis is recommended, although individual board members have no legal authority to make decisions without consideration by the whole board.

**Electronic Submission of Public Comment:**

1. Email your comments to [publiccomments@srvusd.net](mailto:publiccomments@srvusd.net). Emails will be automatically forwarded to each Board Member and will be entered into the official minutes.
  - a. Public comments received from the time the agenda is posted through the end of the open session portion of the meeting, will be included in the minutes.
  - b. Public comments received 4 hours or less prior to the start of open session will be included in the minutes, but may not be read by all Board Members prior to the meeting.
  - c. No email attachments will be accepted with electronically submitted public comment.
  - d. Email addresses will not be included in the public record in order to protect the privacy of commenters.

**Closed Session:** Closed session meetings are not open to the public. By law, matters dealing with students and district employees are reserved for closed session to provide confidentiality. Other closed session topics can include litigation, property negotiations, and collective bargaining issues with employee associations. Members of the public are given the opportunity to speak regarding closed session items prior to the closed session.

**Action items** are considered and voted on individually by the board. **Consent items** are considered routine in nature and are approved by combining them into a single vote. A member of the Board of Education or a member of the public may request that a consent item be removed from the consent agenda and voted on separately.

Copies of board agenda backup and other informational materials provided to members of the Board of Education are available for review in the Office of the Superintendent beginning at 4:00 PM on the last working day of the week preceding each meeting of the Board of Education. For disability related modification or accommodation, please contact the Office of the Superintendent at 552-2933 during business hours.

On July 28, 2021, the California Department of Public Health updated its guidance for face coverings for indoor public settings, which included local board and commission meetings. According to the guidelines a board may choose to follow one of the following:

- Provide information to all patrons, guests and attendees regarding vaccination requirements and allow vaccinated individuals to self-attest that they are in compliance prior to entry.
- Require proof of vaccination.
- Require all patrons to wear masks.

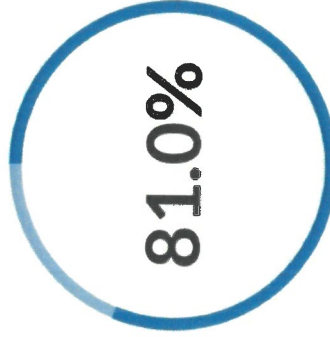

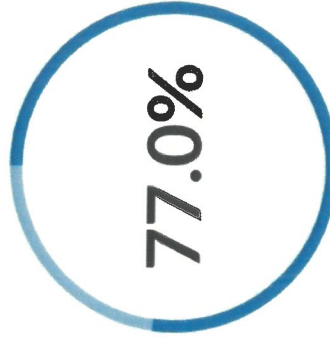

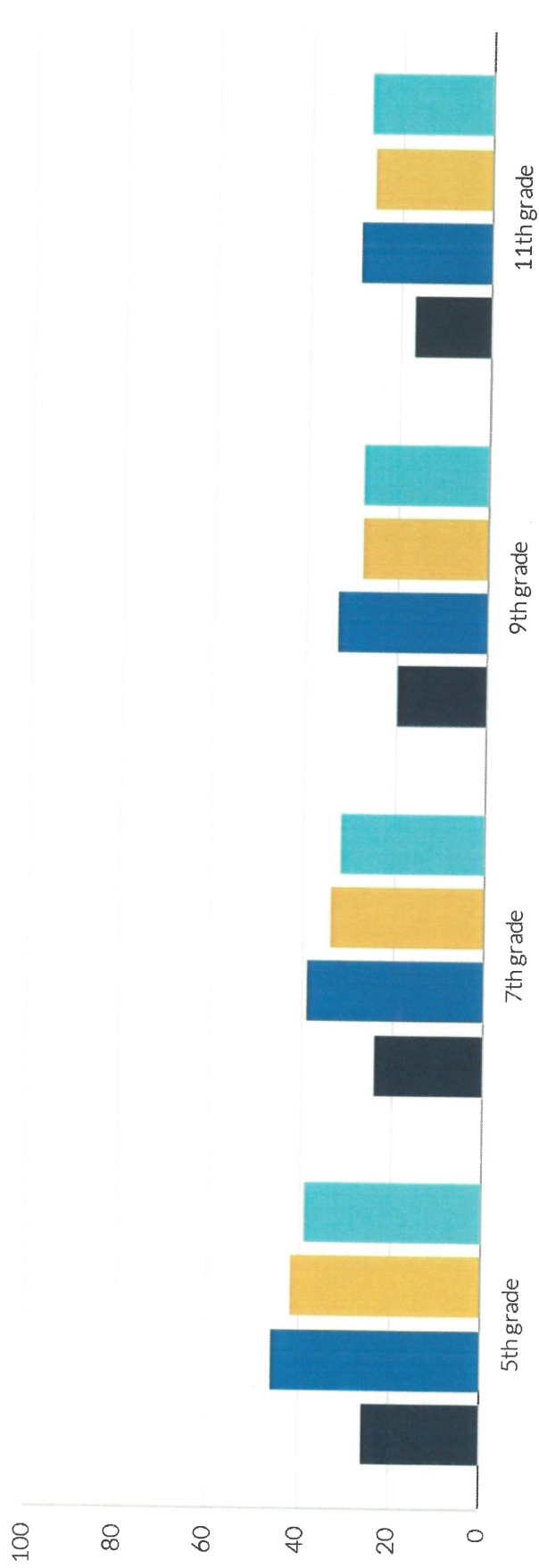

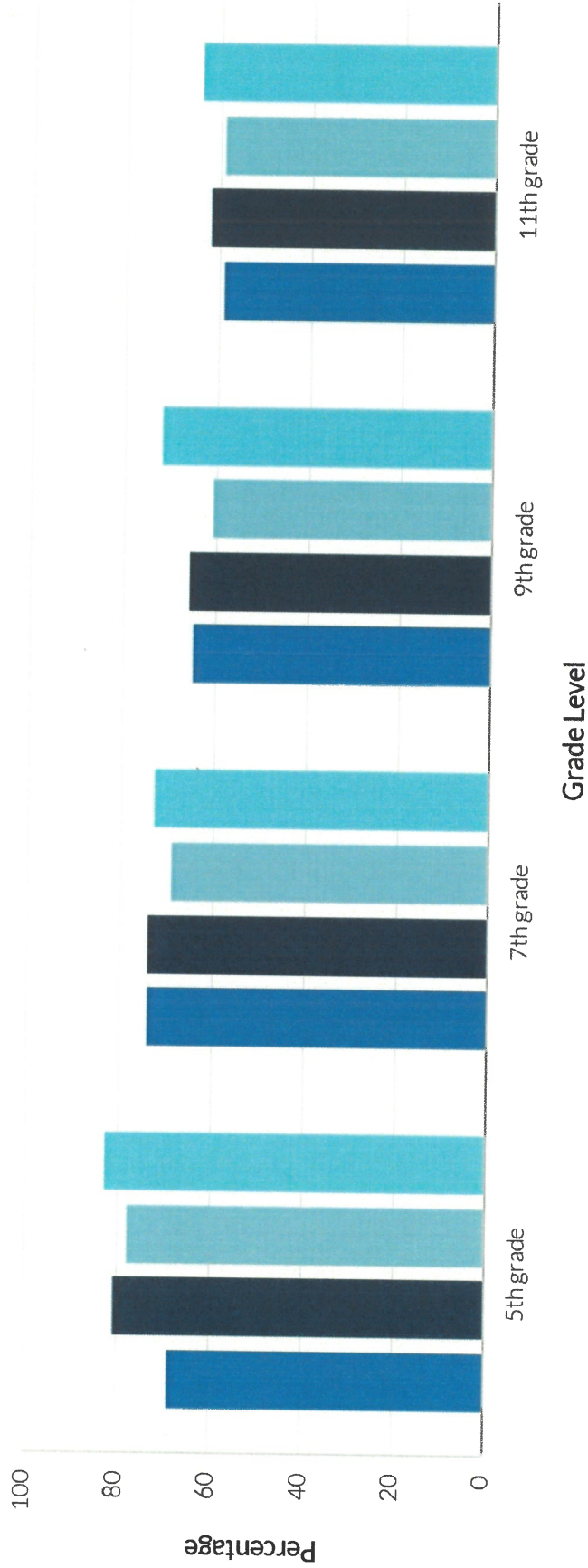

● 2016-17 ● 2018-19 ● 2019-20 ● 2020-21

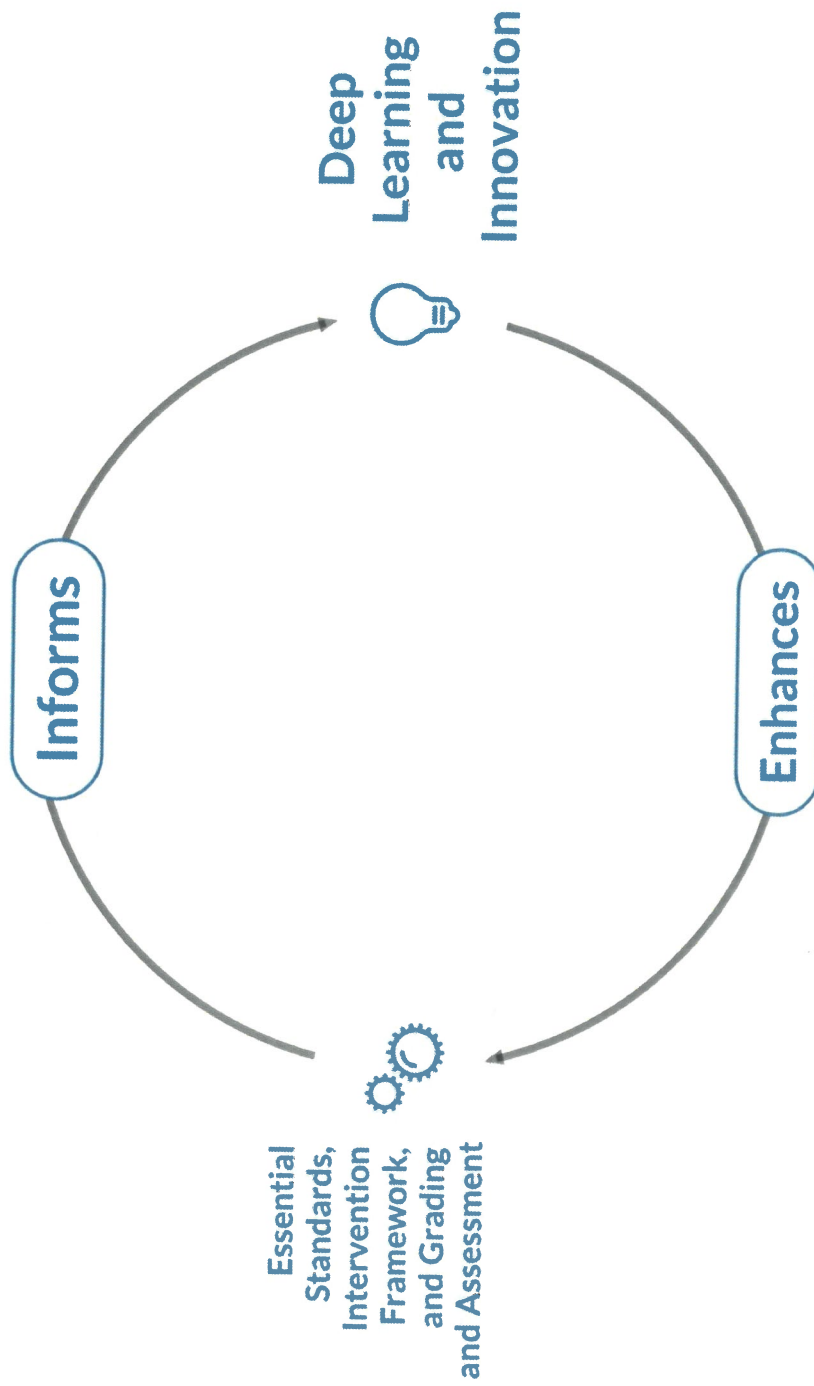

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## Uniform Complaint Procedures

### BP 1312.3 Community Relations

The Board of Education recognizes that the district has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The Board encourages the early, ~~informal~~ resolution of complaints whenever possible and appropriate. To resolve complaints which ~~cannot be resolved through such informal~~ may require a more formal process, the Board shall adopt ~~the~~ a uniform system of complaint processes specified in 5 CCR 4600-4670-4694, as applicable, and the accompanying administrative regulation.

However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving sexual assault or where there is a reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the use of ADR is consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.~~

### Retaliation and Confidentiality

~~The district shall protect all complainants from retaliation. In investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the Superintendent or designee shall keep the identity of the complainant and/or the subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, confidential when appropriate and~~  
~~In filing and investigating complaints, the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. As appropriate for any complaint alleging retaliation, unlawful discrimination, or bullying, the Superintendent or designee shall keep confidential the identity of the complainant and/or the subject of the complaint, if he/she is different from the complainant, as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.~~

Except as the Board of Trustees may otherwise specifically provide in other district policies, these ~~general~~ uniform complaint procedures (UCP) shall be used to investigate and resolve only the complaints specified in BP 1312.3.

#### **Filing of Complaints**

~~The complaint shall be presented to the Compliance Officer who shall maintain a log of complaints received, providing each with a code number and a date stamp. [ 7]~~

All complaints shall be filed in writing, signed by the complainant, and filed with the Compliance Officer, whenever possible. If a complainant is unable to put a complaint in writing due to conditions such as a disability or illiteracy, district staff shall assist the complainant in the filing of the complaint. The signature on a complaint may be handwritten, typed (including in an email), or electronically generated. (5 CCR 4600)



All school personnel who are in receipt of a complaint that pertains to UCP shall immediately notify the site administrator. All UCP complaints filed with a site administrator will be forwarded to a Compliance Officer. All parties involved in the allegations shall be notified when a complaint is filed and when a decision or ruling is made. The Compliance Officer shall keep all complaints or allegations of retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying) confidential except when disclosure is necessary to carry out the investigation, take subsequent corrective action, conduct ongoing monitoring, or maintain the integrity of the process. (5 CCR 4630, 4964)

All complaints shall also be filed in accordance with the following rules, as applicable:

1. A ~~written~~ complaint alleging district violation of applicable state or federal law or regulations governing the programs specified in the accompanying Board policy (items #1 through 26 of the section "Complaints Subject to UCP") ~~adult education programs, consolidated categorical aid programs, migrant education, career technical and technical education and training programs, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs, and special education programs~~ may be filed by any individual, public agency, or organization. A complaint about a violation of the prohibition against the charging of unlawful student fees may be filed with the principal of the school or with the Superintendent or designee. However, any such complaint shall be filed no later than one year from the date the alleged violation occurred. (Education Code 49013, 52075; 5 CCR 4630)
3. A complaint alleging unlawful discrimination, ~~including such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying~~, may be filed only by a persons who alleges that ~~he/she/they~~ have personally suffered unlawful discrimination or ~~by a person who believes that an individual or any specific class of individuals has been subjected to unlawful discrimination~~, or by a duly authorized representative who alleges that an individual student has been subjected to unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying, ~~subjected to it~~. The complaint shall be initiated no later than six months from the date ~~when that~~ the alleged unlawful discrimination occurred, or six months from the date when the complainant first obtained knowledge of the facts of the alleged unlawful discrimination. The time for filing may be extended for up to 90 days by the Superintendent or designee for good cause upon written request by the complainant setting forth the reasons for the extension. (5 CCR 4630)
4. When a complaint alleging unlawful discrimination, ~~including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying or bullying~~ is filed anonymously, the Compliance Officer shall pursue an investigation or other response as appropriate, ~~depending on the specificity and reliability of~~ based on the information provided and the seriousness of the allegation.
5. When the complainant ~~or alleged victim~~ of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, or bullying or the alleged victim, when not the complainant, requests confidentiality, the Compliance Officer shall inform ~~him/her~~ the complainant or victim that the request may limit the district's ability to investigate the conduct or take other necessary action. When honoring a request for confidentiality, the district ~~will~~ shall nevertheless take all reasonable steps to investigate and resolve/respond to the complaint consistent with the request.
6. If a complainant is unable to put a complaint in writing due to conditions such as a disability or illiteracy, district staff shall assist him/her in the filing of the complaint. (5 CCR 4600)

## ~~Mediation~~ [ 8 ]

~~Within three business days after The Compliance Officer receives the complaint, he/she may informally discuss with all the parties the possibility of using mediation. Mediation shall may be offered to resolve complaints that involve more than one student and no adult. However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving an allegation of sexual assault or where there is a reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate. If the parties agree to mediation, the Compliance Officer shall make all arrangements for this process.~~

~~Before initiating the mediation of a complaint alleging retaliation or, unlawful discrimination, or bulling such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, the Compliance Officer shall ensure that all parties agree to make the mediator a party to relevant confidential information. The Compliance Officer shall also notify all parties of the right to end the informal process at any time.~~

~~If the mediation process does not resolve the problem within the parameters of law, the Compliance Officer shall proceed with his/her an investigation of the complaint.~~

~~The use of mediation shall not extend the district's timelines for investigating and resolving the complaint unless the complainant agrees in writing to such an extension of time. If mediation is successful and the complaint is withdrawn, then the district shall take only the actions agreed to through the mediation. If mediation is unsuccessful, the district shall then continue with subsequent steps specified in this administrative regulation.~~

## Investigation of Complaint

~~Within 20 business days after the compliance officer receives the complaint, the compliance officer shall begin an investigation into the complaint. [ 9 ]~~

~~Within 10 business days of initiating the investigation, the The Compliance Officer shall provide the complainant and/or his/her the complainant's representative with the opportunity to present the information contained in the complaint to the compliance officer and shall notify the complainant and/or his/her representative of the opportunity to present the compliance officer with any evidence, or information leading to evidence, to support the allegations in the complaint. Such evidence or information may be presented at any time during the investigation.~~

~~In conducting the investigation, the Compliance Officer shall determine the proper investigation procedures to ensure an unbiased and thorough investigation. Generally, an investigation will include collection of all available documents and review all available records, notes, or statements related to the complaint, including any additional evidence or information received from the parties during the course of the investigation. The Compliance Officer/Investigator shall individually interview all available witnesses with information pertinent to the complaint, and may visit any reasonably accessible location where the relevant actions are alleged to have taken place. At appropriate intervals, the Compliance Officer/Investigator shall inform both parties of the status of the investigation. collect all available documents and review all available records, notes, or statements related to the complaint, including any additional evidence or information received from the parties during the course of the investigation, shall individually interview all available witnesses with information pertinent to the complaint, and may visit any reasonably accessible location where the relevant actions are alleged to have taken place. To resolve a complaint alleging retaliation, unlawful discrimination, or bullying, the compliance officer shall interview the alleged victim(s), any alleged offenders, and other relevant witnesses privately, separately, and in a confidential manner. As necessary, additional staff or legal counsel may conduct or support the investigation.~~

~~The Compliance Officer/Investigator shall interview the alleged victim(s), any alleged offenders, and other relevant witnesses privately, separately, and in a confidential manner to the extent practicable. As necessary, additional staff or legal counsel may conduct or support the investigation.~~

A complainant's refusal to provide the district's Compliance Officer/Investigator with documents or other evidence related to the allegations in the complaint, failure or refusal to cooperate in the investigation, or engagement in any other obstruction of the investigation may result in the dismissal of the complaint because of a lack of evidence to support the allegation(s). Similarly, a respondent's refusal to provide the district's Compliance Officer/Investigator with documents or other evidence related to the allegations in the complaint, failure or refusal to cooperate in the investigation, or engagement in any other obstruction of the investigation may result in a finding, based on evidence collected, that a violation has occurred and in the imposition of a remedy in favor of the complainant. (5 CCR 4631)

In accordance with law, the district shall provide the Compliance Officer/Investigator with access to records and other information related to the allegation(s) in the complaint and shall not in any way obstruct the investigation. Failure or refusal of the district to cooperate in the investigation may result in a finding based on evidence collected that a violation has occurred and in the imposition of a remedy in favor of the complainant. (5 CCR 4631)

The Compliance Officer/Investigator shall apply a "preponderance of the evidence" standard in determining the veracity of the factual allegations in a complaint. This standard is met if the allegation is more likely to be true than not.

#### Investigation Report [ 10]of Findings

Unless extended by written agreement with the complainant, the Compliance Officer shall prepare and send to the complainant a written report, ~~of the district's investigation and decision, as described herein in the section "Final Written Decision" below,~~ within 60 calendar days of the district's receipt of the complaint. (5 CCR 4631)

For any complaint alleging unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying), the respondent shall be informed of any extension of the timeline agreed to by the complainant. The respondent also shall be sent the district's written report at the same time it is provided to the complainant. [ 11]

#### Final Written Decision

The district's decision shall be in writing and shall be sent to the complainant. (5 CCR 4631)

~~In consultation with district legal counsel, information about the relevant part of a decision may be communicated to a victim who is not the complainant and to other parties that may be involved in implementing the decision or affected by the complaint, as long as the privacy of the parties is protected.~~

~~If the complaint involves a limited English proficient student or parent/guardian and the student involved attends a school at which 15 percent or more of the students speak a single primary language other than English, then the decision shall also be translated into that language. ~~6. Notice of the complainant's right to appeal the district's decision within 15 calendar days to the CDE and procedures to be followed for initiating such an appeal~~

The ~~decision~~-investigation report may also include follow-up procedures to prevent recurrence or retaliation and for reporting any subsequent problems.

In consultation with district legal counsel, information about the relevant part of an ~~an decision~~-investigation report may be communicated to a victim who is not the complainant and to other parties ~~that who~~ may be involved in implementing the decision or are affected by the complaint, as long as the privacy of the parties is protected. In a complaint alleging unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying), notice of the district's investigation report to the alleged victim shall include information about any sanction to be imposed upon the respondent that relates directly to the alleged victim.

If the complaint involves a limited-English-proficient student or parent/guardian and the student involved ~~attends~~ is enrolled in a school at which 15 percent or more of the students speak a single primary language other than English, then the ~~decision~~-investigation report shall also be translated into that language pursuant to Education Code 48985. In ~~other~~ all other instances, the district shall ensure meaningful access to all relevant information for parents/guardians with limited English proficiency. [14]

For complaints alleging unlawful discrimination ~~based on state law, including (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying), based on state law,~~ the ~~decision~~-investigation report shall also include a notice to the complainant that:

1. ~~He/she~~The complainant may pursue available civil law remedies outside of the district's complaint procedures, including seeking assistance from mediation centers or public/private interest attorneys, 60 calendar days after the filing of an appeal with the CDE. (Education Code 262.3)
2. The 60-~~days~~ moratorium does not apply to complaints seeking injunctive relief in state courts or to discrimination complaints based on federal law. (Education Code 262.3)
3. Complaints alleging discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, gender, disability, or age may also be filed with the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights at www.ed.gov/ocr within 180 days of the alleged discrimination.
- 3-4. If an employee is disciplined as a result of the complaint, the investigation report shall simply state that effective action was taken and that the employee was informed of district expectations. The report shall not give any further information as to the nature of the disciplinary action.

### **Corrective Actions**

When a complaint is found to have merit, the ~~C~~compliance ~~O~~fficer shall adopt any appropriate corrective action permitted by law. Appropriate corrective actions that focus on the larger school or district environment may include, but are not limited to, actions to reinforce district policies; ~~;~~ training for faculty, staff, and students; ~~;~~ updates to school policies; ~~;~~ or school climate surveys.

When a complaint is found to have merit, an appropriate remedy shall be provided to the complainant or other affected person.

For complaints involving retaliation ~~or;~~ unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying); ~~or bullying,~~ appropriate ~~corrective actions that focus on the victim~~remedies that may be offered to the victim but not communicated to the respondent may include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Counseling;
2. Academic support;
3. Health services;
4. Assignment of an escort to allow the victim to move safely about campus;
5. Information regarding available resources and how to report similar incidents or retaliation;
6. Separation of the victim from any other individuals involved, provided the separation does not penalize the victim;
7. Restorative justice; and/or
8. Follow-up inquiries to ensure that the conduct has stopped and there has been no retaliation.

~~9. Determination of whether any past actions of the victim that resulted in discipline were related to the treatment the victim received and described in the complaint~~

For complaints involving retaliation ~~or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), or bullying,~~ appropriate corrective actions that focus on a student offender may include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Transfer from a class or school as permitted by law;
2. Parent/guardian conference;
3. Education regarding the impact of the conduct on others;
4. Positive behavior support;
5. Referral to a student success team;
6. Denial of participation in extracurricular or co-curricular activities or other privileges as permitted by law; and/or
7. Disciplinary action, such as suspension or expulsion, as permitted by law.

When an employee is found to have committed retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the district shall take appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal, in accordance with applicable law and collective bargaining agreement.

The district may also consider training and other interventions for the larger school community to ensure that students, staff, and parents/guardians understand the types of behavior that constitute unlawful discrimination, ~~including~~ (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), that the district does not tolerate it, and how to report and respond to it.

If a complaint alleging noncompliance with the laws regarding student fees, deposits, and other charges, physical education instructional minutes, or any requirement related to the LCAP is found to have merit, the district shall provide a remedy to all affected students and parents/guardians subject to procedures established by regulation of the State Board of Education. (Education Code 49013, 51222, 51223, 52075). (~~Education Code 49013, 52075~~)

For complaints alleging noncompliance with the laws regarding student fees, the district shall attempt in good faith, by engaging in reasonable efforts, to identify and fully reimburse all affected students and parents/guardians who paid the unlawful student fees within one year prior to the filing of the complaint. (Education Code 49013; 5 CCR 4600) ~~such remedies, where applicable, shall include reasonable efforts to ensure full reimbursement to affected students and parents/guardians. (Education Code 49013; 5 CCR 4600)~~

Appeals to the California Department of Education (CDE)

Any complainant who is dissatisfied with the district's ~~final written decision~~ investigation report on a complaint regarding any specified federal or state educational program subject to UCP, may file an appeal in writing with the CDE within 15-30 calendar days [ 15] of receiving the district's decision ~~investigation report.~~ (Education Code 49013, 52075; 5 CCR 4632)

The appeal shall be sent to CDE with a copy of the original locally filed complaint and a copy of the district's investigation report for that complaint. The complainant shall specify and explain the basis for the appeal, including at least one of the following: (5 CCR 4632)

1. The district failed to follow its complaint procedures;
2. Relative to the allegations of the complaint, the district's investigation report lacks material findings of fact necessary to reach a conclusion of law;
3. The material findings of fact in the district's investigation report are not supported by substantial evidence;
4. The legal conclusion in the district's investigation report is inconsistent with law; and/or
5. In a case in which the district found noncompliance, the corrective actions fail to provide a proper remedy.

The CDE will not process an appeal if it is untimely or if it fails to include this information. (5 CCR 4632)

~~The complainant shall specify the basis for the appeal of the decision and whether the facts are incorrect and/or the law has been misapplied. The appeal shall be accompanied by a copy of the locally filed complaint and a copy of the district's decision. (5 CCR 4632)~~

Upon notification by the CDE that the complainant has appealed the district's ~~decision~~ investigation report, the Superintendent or designee shall forward the following documents to the CDE within 10 days of the date of notification: (5 CCR 4633)

1. A copy of the original complaint.
2. A copy of the ~~decision~~ written investigation report.
3. ~~A summary of the nature and extent of the investigation conducted by the district, if not covered by the decision~~

3. 4. A copy of the investigation file including, but not limited to, all notes, interviews, and documents submitted by the parties and gathered by the investigator.
4. 5. A report of any action taken to resolve the complaint.
5. 6. A copy of the district's uniform complaint procedures.
6. 7. Other relevant information requested by the CDE.

The district's failure to provide a timely and complete response may result in the CDE ruling on the appeal without considering information from the district. (5 CCR 4633)

If notified by CDE that the district's investigation report failed to address allegation(s) raised by the complaint, the district shall, within 20 days of the notification, provide CDE and the appellant with an amended investigation report that addresses the allegation(s) that were not addressed in the original investigation report. The amended report shall also inform the appellant of the right to separately appeal the amended report with respect to the allegation(s) that were not addressed in the original report. (5 CCR 4632)

### **Health and Safety Complaints in California State Preschool Program (CSPP) [ 16]**

UCP complaints regarding state preschool health and safety issues in a license-exempt CSPP program shall comply with the following:

1. All complaints shall be filed with the preschool program administrator or designee, and may be filed anonymously. The complaint form shall specify the location for filing the complaint and shall contain a space to indicate whether the complainant desires a response to the complaint. A complainant may add as much text to explain the complaint as he or she wishes. A complainant who self-identifies is entitled to a response if the complainant indicates that a response is requested. Any response, if requested, shall be written in English and the primary language in which the complaint was filed.
2. If it is determined that the complaint is beyond the authority of the preschool program administrator, the matter shall be forwarded to the Superintendent or designee in a timely manner, not to exceed 10 working days, for resolution. (Education Code 8235.5)
3. Investigation of a complaint regarding health or safety issues in a license-exempt CSPP program shall begin within 10 days of receipt of the complaint. (Education Code 8235.5)
4. The preschool administrator or designee shall remedy a valid complaint within a reasonable time period not to exceed 30 working days from the date the complaint was received. If the complainant has indicated on the complaint form a desire to receive a response to the complaint, the preschool administrator or Superintendent's designee shall report the resolution of the complaint to the complainant within 45 working days of the initial filing of the complaint.
5. If the preschool administrator makes this report, the information shall be reported at the same time to the Superintendent or designee.
6. A complainant not satisfied with the resolution of the complaint has the right to describe the complaint to the Governing Board at a regularly scheduled meeting. (Education Code 8235.5)
7. A complainant may file a written appeal of the district's decision to CDE in accordance with 5 CCR 4632 as described above. (Education Code 8235.5) Any appeal must be filed within 30 days of the date of the complainant's receipt of the district's report. [ 17]



8. The district shall report summarized data on the nature and resolution of all CSPP health and safety complaints by general subject area with the number of resolved and unresolved complaints, on a quarterly basis to the Board at a regularly scheduled meeting, and to the County Superintendent of Schools. [ 18]
9. All complaints and responses are public records. (Education Code 8235.5)

The Board also prohibits retaliation against any district employee or job applicant who opposes any discriminatory employment practice by the district or its employees, agents, or representatives or who complains, testifies, assists,

Measures to Prevent Discrimination

To prevent unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation in district employment, the Superintendent or designee shall implement the following measures:

1. Display | 4 | in a prominent and accessible location at every work site where the district has employees, and post electronically in a conspicuous location on computers for employee use, up-to-date California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) posters on the prohibition of workplace discrimination and harassment, the rights of transgender employees, and the rights and obligations of employees who are pregnant, have a related medical condition, or are recovering from childbirth. - b. Posting them in all district schools and offices, including staff lounges and other prominent locations.
- c. Posting them on the district's web site and providing easy access to them through district-supported social media, when available.

3. Disseminate the district's nondiscrimination policy and administrative regulation to all employees by one or more of the following methods: (2 CCR 11023)

  - b. Sending a copy via email with an acknowledgment return form.
  - c. Posting a copy on the district intranet with a tracking system ensuring all employees have read and acknowledged receipt of the policies.
  - d. Discussing the policy and regulation with employees upon hire and/or during a new hire orientation session.
  - e. Any other way that ensures employees receive and understand the policy.

4. Provide to employees a handbook that contains information that clearly describes the district's nondiscrimination policy, procedures for filing a complaint, and resources available to employees who believe they have been the victim of any discriminatory or harassing behavior.

~~Provide training regarding the district's nondiscrimination policy, including what constitutes unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation and how and to whom a report of an incident should be made.~~ 5]

5. Periodically review the district's recruitment, hiring, and promotion processes and regularly monitor the terms, conditions, and privileges of employment to ensure district compliance with law.

6. For any district facility where 10 percent of employees have a language other than English as their spoken language, translate the policy into every language spoken by at least 10 percent of the workforce. (2 CCR 11023)

### Complaint Procedure (2 CCR 11023)

To the extent required by law, complaints of sexual harassment shall be addressed in accordance with AR 4119.12/4219.12/4319.12 - Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures if the alleged conduct meets the definition of sexual harassment pursuant to 34 CFR 106.30.

Any other complaint alleging unlawful discrimination or harassment shall be addressed in accordance with the following procedures:

#### Notice and Receipt of Complaint

A complainant may report a complaint to a direct supervisor, another supervisor, the Coordinator, or the Superintendent or designee. The complainant's direct supervisor may be bypassed in filing a complaint when the supervisor is the subject of the complaint.

The complainant may first attempt to resolve the situation informally with the supervisor before filing a written complaint.

A supervisor or manager who has received information about an incident of discrimination or harassment, or has observed such an incident, shall report it to the Coordinator, whether or not the complainant files a written complaint.

The written complaint should contain the complainant's name and contact information, the name of the individual who allegedly engaged in the conduct, a description of the conduct alleged, the date(s) and location(s) where the alleged conduct occurred, any witnesses who may have relevant information, any available evidence of the discrimination or harassment, and any other pertinent information which may assist in addressing the complaint.

The Nondiscrimination Coordinator shall assign a staff member to assist the complainant with completing a written complaint if such help is needed.

#### Investigation

The Coordinator shall promptly initiate an impartial investigation of allegation(s) of discrimination or harassment regardless of whether a written complaint has been filed or whether the written complaint is complete. The Coordinator may investigate the complaint or assign an investigator.

The Coordinator shall meet with the complainant to describe the district's complaint procedure and discuss the actions being sought by the complainant in response to the allegation(s). The Coordinator shall inform the complainant that the investigation of the allegations will be fair, timely, and thorough and will be conducted in a manner consistent with this Administrative

Regulation to reach reasonable conclusions based on the evidence collected. The Coordinator shall also inform the parties that the investigation will be kept confidential to the extent possible, but that some information may be disclosed as necessary to conduct an effective investigation.

If the Coordinator determines that a detailed fact-finding investigation is necessary, the Coordinator or assigned investigator will interview the complainant, the person(s) accused, and other persons who may have relevant information.-

The Coordinator will monitor the progress of the investigation to ensure reasonable progress and shall inform the parties as necessary.

When necessary to carry out the investigation or to protect employee safety, the Coordinator may discuss the complaint with the Superintendent or designee, or district legal counsel, ~~or the district's risk manager.~~

The Coordinator also shall determine whether interim measures, such as scheduling changes, transfers, or leaves, will be implemented as appropriate. The Coordinator shall ensure that such interim measures do not constitute retaliation.

#### Written Report on Findings and Remedial/Corrective Action

[Within 60 days ] 7]after receiving the complaint, the Coordinator or assigned investigator shall conclude the investigation and prepare a written report of the findings. This timeline may be extended for good cause. If an extension is needed, the Coordinator shall notify the parties.

The report shall include the decision and the reasons for the decision and shall summarize the steps taken during the investigation. If a determination has been made that discrimination or harassment occurred, the report also shall include any corrective action(s) that have been or will be taken to address the behavior, provide appropriate options for remedial actions and resolutions for the complainant, and ensure that retaliation or further discrimination or harassment is prevented. The report shall be presented to the Superintendent or designee.

A summary of the findings shall be provided to the complainant and the person accused.

#### Appeal

The complainant or the person accused may appeal the summary of findings to the Superintendent or designee within ten (10) days of receiving the summary of findings. . The Superintendent or designee will render its decision within twenty (20) [OR INSERT NUMBER OF DAYS] business days.] 8]

### **Retaliation Prohibited**

The District prohibits retaliation in any form related to the filing of a complaint, the reporting of instances of discrimination or harassment, or for participation in the complaint procedures. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status or work assignments of the complainant.

### **Other Remedies**

In addition to filing a discrimination or harassment complaint with the district, an individual may file a complaint with either DFEH or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC). The time limits for filing such complaints are as follows:

1. For filing a complaint with DFEH alleging a violation of Government Code 12940-12952, within three years of the alleged discriminatory act(s), unless an exception exists pursuant to Government Code 12960. (Government Code 12960)
2. For filing a complaint with EEOC, within 180 days of the alleged discriminatory act(s). (42 USC 2000e-5)
3. For filing a complaint with EEOC after first filing a complaint with DFEH, within 300 days of the alleged discriminatory act(s) or within 30 days after the termination of proceedings by DFEH, whichever is earlier. (42 USC 2000e-5)

The following policy shall apply to all district employees, interns, volunteers, contractors, job applicants, and other persons with an employment relationship with the district.

The Board of Education is committed to providing a safe work environment that is free of harassment and intimidation. prohibits sexual harassment of district employees and job applicants. The Board also prohibits sexual harassment against district employees and retaliatory behavior or action against district employees or other persons who complain, testify or otherwise participate in the complaint process established pursuant to this policy and accompanying Administrative Regulation.

4. Taking timely and appropriate corrective/remedial action(s), ~~which may require interim separation of the complainant and the alleged harasser and subsequent monitoring of developments~~

~~The Superintendent or designee shall periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the district's strategies to prevent and address harassment. Such evaluation may involve conducting regular anonymous employee surveys to assess whether harassment is occurring or is perceived to be tolerated, partnering with researchers or other agencies with the needed expertise to evaluate the district's prevention strategies, and using any other effective tool for receiving feedback on systems and/or processes. As necessary, changes shall be made to the harassment policy, complaint procedures, or training [ 2].~~

### **Sexual Harassment Reports and Complaints**

All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or to take other subsequent necessary actions possible and consistent with applicable law. (2 CCR 11023)(5 CCR 4964)

The following administrative regulation shall apply to all allegations of sexual harassment involving employees, interns, volunteers, and job applicants, but shall not be used to resolve any complaint by or against a student.

**Definitions**

~~Prohibited~~ Sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or ~~other~~ unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made ~~against another~~ by a person of the same or opposite sex in the work or educational setting when: (Education Code 212.5; Government Code 12940; 2 CCR 11034) ~~5 CCR 4916~~

1. Submission to the conduct is made explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's employment.
2. Submission to or rejection of ~~such the~~ conduct by the individual is used as the basis for an employment decision affecting ~~him/her~~ the individual.
3. The conduct has the purpose or effect of ~~having a negative impact upon the~~ unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working or educational environment or of adversely affecting the individual's performance, evaluation, advancement, assigned duties, or any other condition of employment or career development. ~~Regardless of whether or not the alleged harasser was motivated by sexual desire, the conduct is sufficiently severe, persistent, pervasive, or objectively offensive so as to create a hostile or abusive working environment or to limit the individual's ability to participate in or benefit from an education program or activity.~~
4. Submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by the ~~other~~ individual is used as the basis for any decision affecting ~~him/her~~ the individual regarding benefits, services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through the district.

**Examples of Sexual Harassment**

~~Other~~ Examples of actions that might constitute sexual harassment in the work or educational setting, whether committed by a supervisor, a co-worker, or a non-employee, in the work or educational setting or any other individual, include, but are not limited to:

1. Unwelcome verbal conduct such as sexual flirtations or propositions; graphic comments about an individual's body; overly personal conversations or pressure for sexual activity;

- sexual jokes or stories; unwelcome sexual slurs, leering, epithets, threats, innuendoes, verbal abuse, derogatory comments, sexually degrading descriptions, or the spreading of sexual rumors.
2. Unwelcome visual conduct such as drawings, pictures, graffiti, or gestures; sexually explicit emails; displaying sexually suggestive objects in the educational or work environment.
  3. Unwelcome physical conduct such as massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body; touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way; purposefully cornering, blocking, leaning over, or impeding normal movements of an individual.
  4. Sexual assault, sexual battery, or sexual coercion.
  5. Electronic communications containing comments, words, or images described above.
  - 3-6. Any act of retaliation against an individual who reports a violation of the district's sexual harassment policy, or who participates in the investigation of a sexual harassment complaint.

### Reporting Complaints

Any employee who believes that they have experienced or witnessed sexual harassment by a student, employee, or a third party should immediately report the alleged act(s) or incident(s) to the district's Title IX Coordinator/Nondiscrimination Coordinator, principal, or any other supervisor with whom the employee feels comfortable.

Promptly after receiving such a report, the supervisor or principal shall notify the district's Title IX Coordinator/Nondiscrimination Coordinator. All school employees who observe an incident of sexual harassment shall promptly report it to the district's Title IX Coordinator/Nondiscrimination Coordinator, regardless of whether the alleged victim files a formal complaint.

### Complaint Procedures

All reports of sexual harassment by and against employees shall be addressed in accordance with applicable law and district procedures. The Title IX Coordinator/Nondiscrimination Coordinator shall review the allegations to determine the applicable procedure for responding to the allegations. All reports that meet the definition of sexual harassment under Title IX shall be addressed pursuant to the district's Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 4119.12/4219.12/4319.12) and applicable law. Other sexual harassment reports shall be addressed pursuant to Nondiscrimination in Employment (AR 4030) [4] and applicable law.

### Training [ 5]

Every two years, ~~the~~ Superintendent or designee shall ensure that supervisory employees receive at least two hours, and nonsupervisory employees receive at least one hour, of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding sexual harassment. ~~all employees receive information regarding the district's sexual harassment policies when hired and annually thereafter. All newly hired employees and employees promoted to a supervisory position shall receive training within six months of their assumption of the new position. The District's sexual harassment training and education program shall be provided in accordance with applicable law. (Government Code 12950.1) Such information shall include the procedures for reporting and/or filing complaints involving an employee, employees' duty to use the district's complaint procedures, and employee obligations when a sexual harassment report involving a student is made to the employee.~~

~~Every two years, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that supervisory employees receive at least two hours of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding~~

~~sexual harassment. All newly hired or promoted supervisory employees shall receive training within six months of their assumption of the supervisory position. A supervisory employee is any employee with having the authority, in the interest of the district, to hire, transfer, suspend, lay off, promote, discharge, assign, reward, or discipline other employees, or the responsibility to direct them, adjust their grievances, or effectively recommend such action, when the exercise of the authority is not of a merely routine or clerical nature, but requires the use of independent judgment. (Government Code 12926). ~~or to effectively recommend such action.~~

Such training may be completed by employees individually or as part of a group presentation, may be completed in shorter segments as long as the applicable hourly requirement is met, and may be provided in conjunction with other training provided to the employees. 1. Information and practical guidance regarding federal and state laws ~~on~~ concerning the prohibition, ~~against and the prevention,~~ and correction of sexual harassment, and the remedies available to the victims of sexual harassment in employment.
2. The types of conduct that constitute sexual harassment.
3. Remedies available for victims in civil actions, and potential employer/individual exposure/liability.
4. Strategies to prevent harassment in the workplace.
5. A supervisor's obligation to report sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation of which they ~~became~~become aware.
- 2-6. Practical examples which illustrate sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation using training modalities such as role plays, case studies, and group discussions, based on factual scenarios taken from case law, news and media accounts, and hypotheticals based on workplace situations and other sources aimed at instructing supervisors in the prevention of harassment, discrimination, and retaliation.

Employees shall receive a copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and administrative regulations, which they shall read and acknowledge that they have received.~~A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and administrative regulation.~~

12. Information, including practical examples, of harassment based on gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation.
13. Prevention of abusive conduct, including a review of the definition and elements of abusive conduct pursuant to Government Code 12950.1, the negative effects that abusive conduct has on the victim and others in the workplace, the detrimental consequences of this conduct on employee productivity and morale, and that a single act does not constitute abusive conduct unless the act is severe or egregious.



### BP 5145.3

#### **Nondiscrimination/Harassment/Anti-Bullying**

This policy shall apply to all acts constituting unlawful discrimination or harassment related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school, , and to acts which occur off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored activities but which may have an impact or create a hostile environment at school. (Education Code 234.1)

~~District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination, including harassment, intimidation or bullying with respect to a sex, gender, gender identity or gender expression, ethnic group identification, race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, physical or mental disability, marital or parental status, age or sexual orientation; the perception of one or more of such characteristics, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. [1]~~

The Board of Education desires to provide a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in admission and access to the district's academic, extracurricular, and other educational support programs, guidance and counseling programs, athletic programs, testing procedures, and otherservices and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying, of any student by anyone, based on the student's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, national origin, immigration status, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or genetic information, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

~~The Board prohibits discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying of any student by any employee, student or other person in the district. Staff shall be alert and immediately responsive to student conduct which may interfere with another student's ability to participate in or benefit from school services, activities or privileges. Prohibited Unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation or bullying, includes may result from physical, verbal, nonverbal or written conduct based on one any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination occurs when prohibited conduct that is so severe, persistent, or and pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; is foreseeably likely to cause a substantial disruption to the educational environment; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.~~

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any student-individual who reports or participates in the reporting of unlawful discrimination, files or participates in the filing of a complaint, or investigates or participates in the investigation of a complaint or report alleging unlawful discrimination, or report regarding an incident of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall post the district's policies prohibiting discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying and other required information on the district's website in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students, in accordance with law and the accompanying administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide age-appropriate training and/or information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the district's educational program. The Superintendent or designee shall report the findings and recommendations to the Board after each review. to the students, parents/guardians, and employees regarding discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying, including but not limited to, the district's nondiscrimination policy, what constitutes prohibited behavior, how to report incidents, and to whom such reports should be made.

Regardless of whether a complainant complies with the writing, timeline, and/or other formal filing requirements, all complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, shall be investigated and prompt action taken to stop the discrimination, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, bullying, or retaliation in violation of the law, Board Policy, or Administrative

~~administrative Regulation-regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion for behavior that is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900.4. up to and including counseling, suspension and/or expulsion.~~

Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, bullying, or retaliation shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

~~The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the student handbook clearly describes the district's nondiscrimination policy, procedures for filing a complaint regarding discrimination, harassment, intimidation or bullying, and the resources that are available to students who feel that they have been the victim of any such behavior. The district's policy shall also be posted on the district web site or any other location that is easily accessible to students.~~

To prevent unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, and bullying, of students at district schools or in school activities and to ensure equal access of all students to the educational program, the Superintendent or designee shall implement the following measures:

1. Publicize the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures, including the Coordinator/Compliance Officer's contact information, to students, parents/guardians, employees, volunteers, and the general public by posting them in prominent locations and providing easy access to them through district-supported communications, as available. (Education Code 234.1)
2. Post the district's policies and procedures prohibiting discrimination, harassment, student sexual harassment, intimidation, bullying, and cyberbullying, including a section on social media bullying that includes all of the references described in Education Code 234.6 as

possible forums for social media, in a prominent location on the district's website in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students. (Education Code 234.6)[ 4]

  - a. The name and contact information of the district's Title IX Coordinator, including the phone number and email address;
  - b. The rights of students and the public and the responsibilities of the district under Title IX, including a list of rights as specified in Education Code 221.8 and web links to information about those rights and responsibilities located on the web sites of the Office for Equal Opportunity and the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR);
  - c. A description of how to file a complaint of noncompliance under Title IX which shall include:
    - (1) An explanation of the statute of limitations within which a complaint must be filed after an alleged incident of discrimination has occurred and how a complaint may be filed beyond the statute of limitations;
    - (2) An explanation of how the complaint will be investigated and how the complainant may further pursue the complaint, including web links to this information on the OCR's web site; and
    - (3) A web link to the OCR complaints form and the contact information for the office, including the phone number and email address for the office;
  - d. A link to the Title IX information included on the California Department of Education's (CDE) website.

5. Post a link to statewide CDE-compiled resources, including community-based organizations, that provide support to youth who have been subjected to school-based discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying and to their families. Such resources shall be posted in a prominent location on the district's website in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students. (Education Code 234.5, 234.6)[ 7]

Annually notify all students and parents/guardians of the district's nondiscrimination policy, including its responsibility to provide a safe, nondiscriminatory school environment for all students, including transgender and gender-nonconforming students. The notice shall inform students and parents/guardians that they may request to meet the Compliance Officer to determine how best to accommodate or resolve concerns that may arise from the district's implementation of its nondiscrimination policies. The notice shall also inform all students and parents/guardians that, to the extent possible, the district will address any individual student's interests and concerns in private.

8. Ensure that all students and parents/guardians, including students and parents/guardians with limited English proficiency, are notified of how to access the relevant information provided in the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures, notices, and forms in a language they can understand.

If 15 percent or more of students enrolled in a particular district school speak a single primary language other than English, the district's policy, regulation, forms, and notices concerning nondiscrimination shall be translated into that language in accordance with Education Code 234.1 and 48985. In all other instances, the district shall ensure meaningful access to all relevant information for parents/guardians with limited English proficiency.

9. Provide to students, employees, volunteers, and parents/guardians age-appropriate training and/or information regarding the district's nondiscrimination policy; what constitutes prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying; how and to whom a report of an incident should be made; and how to guard against segregating or stereotyping students when providing instruction, guidance, supervision, or other services to them. Such training and information shall include details of guidelines the district may use to provide a discrimination-free environment for all district students, including transgender and gender-nonconforming students.

The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate actions to reinforce BP 5145.3 - Nondiscrimination/Harassment. As needed, these actions may include any of the following:

1. Removing vulgar or offending graffiti;

4. Consistent with the laws regarding the confidentiality of student and personnel records, communicating to students, parents/guardians, and the community the school's response plan to unlawful discrimination or harassment; and/or

### Process for Initiating and Responding to Complaints[ 9]

Students who feel that they have been subjected to unlawful discrimination described above or in district policy are strongly encouraged to immediately contact the Compliance Officer, principal,

or any other staff member. In addition, students who observe any such incident are strongly encouraged to report the incident to the Compliance Officer or principal, whether or not the alleged victim files a complaint.

Any school employee who witnesses an incident of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, shall immediately intervene to stop the incident when it is safe to do so. (Education Code 234.1)

Any school employee who observes an incident of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation or bullying, or to whom such an incident is reported shall promptly report the incident to the Compliance Officer or principal within a school day, whether or not the alleged victim files a complaint.

When a report of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, is made to or received by the principal or Compliance Officer, the principal or Compliance Officer shall notify the student or parent/guardian of the right to file a formal complaint in accordance with AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures, or, for complaints of sexual harassment that meet the federal Title IX definition, AR 5145.71 – Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures. Once notified verbally or in writing, the Compliance Officer shall begin the investigation and shall implement immediate measures necessary to stop the discrimination and ensure that all students have access to the educational program and a safe school environment. Any interim measures adopted to address unlawful discrimination shall, to the extent possible, not disadvantage the complainant or a student who is the victim of the alleged unlawful discrimination.

Any report or complaint alleging unlawful discrimination by the principal, Compliance Officer, or any other person to whom a report would ordinarily be made or complaint filed shall instead be made to or filed with the Superintendent or designee who shall determine how the complaint will be investigated.

Transgender and Gender-Nonconforming Students[ 10]

Gender identity [ 11]of a student means the student's gender-related identity, appearance, or behavior as determined from the student's internal sense, whether or not that gender-related identity, appearance, or behavior is different from that traditionally associated with the student's physiology or assigned sex at birth.

Gender expression means a student's gender-related appearance and behavior, whether stereotypically associated with the student's assigned sex at birth. (Education Code 210.7)

Gender transition refers to the process in which a student changes from living and identifying as the sex assigned to the student at birth to living and identifying as the sex that corresponds to the student's gender identity.

Gender-nonconforming student means a student whose gender expression differs from stereotypical expectations.

Transgender student means a student whose gender identity is different from the gender assigned at birth.

The district prohibits acts of verbal, nonverbal, or physical aggression, intimidation, or hostility that are based on sex, gender identity, or gender expression, or that have the purpose or effect of producing a negative impact on the student's academic performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment, regardless of whether the acts are sexual in nature. Examples of types of conduct which are prohibited in the district and which may constitute gender-based harassment include, but are not limited to:

1. Refusing to address a student by a name and the pronouns consistent with the student's gender identity;
2. Disciplining or disparaging a student or excluding the student from participating in activities for behavior or appearance that is consistent with the student's gender identity or that does not conform to stereotypical notions of masculinity or femininity, as applicable;
3. Blocking a student's entry to the bathroom that corresponds to the student's gender identity;
4. Taunting a student because the student participates in an athletic activity more typically favored by a student of the other sex;
5. Revealing a student's transgender status to individuals who do not have a legitimate need for the information, without the student's consent;
6. Using gender-specific slurs; and/or
7. Physically assaulting a student motivated by hostility toward the student because of the student's gender, gender identity, or gender expression.

The district's uniform complaint procedures (AR 1312.3), or Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71), as applicable, shall be used to report and resolve complaints alleging discrimination against transgender and gender-nonconforming students.

Examples of bases for complaints include, but are not limited to, the above list as well as improper rejection by the district of a student's asserted gender identity, denial of access to facilities that correspond with a student's gender identity, improper disclosure of a student's transgender status, discriminatory enforcement of a dress code, and other instances of gender-based harassment.

To ensure that transgender and gender-nonconforming students are afforded the same rights, benefits, and protections provided to all students by law and Board policy, the district shall address each situation on a case-by-case basis, in accordance with the following guidelines:

1. Right to privacy: A student's transgender or gender-nonconforming status is the student's private information and the district will only disclose the information to others with the student's prior written consent, except when the disclosure is otherwise required by law or when the district has compelling evidence that disclosure is necessary to preserve the student's physical or mental well-being. In any case, the district shall only allow disclosure of a student's personally identifiable information to employees with a legitimate educational interest as determined by the district pursuant to 34 CFR 99.31. Any district employee to whom a student's transgender or gender-nonconforming status is disclosed shall keep the student's information confidential. When disclosure of a student's gender identity is made to a district employee by a student, the employee shall seek the student's permission to notify the Compliance Officer. If the student refuses to give permission, the employee shall keep the student's information confidential, unless the employee is required to disclose or report the student's information pursuant to this administrative regulation, and shall inform the student that honoring the student's request may limit the district's ability to meet the student's needs related to the student's status as a transgender or gender-nonconforming student. If the student permits the employee to notify the Compliance Officer, the employee shall do so promptly.

As appropriate given the student's need for support, the Compliance Officer may discuss with the student any need to disclose the student's transgender or gender-nonconformity status or gender identity or gender expression to the student's parents/guardians and/or others, including other students, teacher(s), or other adults on campus. The district shall offer support services, such as counseling, to students who wish to inform their parents/guardians of their status and desire assistance in doing so.

2. Determining a Student's Gender Identity: The Compliance Officer shall accept the student's assertion of the student's gender identity and begin to treat the student consistent with that gender identity unless district personnel present a credible and supportable basis for believing that the student's assertion is for an improper purpose.
3. Addressing a Student's Transition Needs: The Compliance Officer shall arrange a meeting with the student and, if appropriate, the student's parents/guardians to identify and develop strategies for ensuring that the student's access to educational programs and activities is maintained. The meeting shall discuss the transgender or gender-nonconforming student's rights and how those rights may affect and be affected by the rights of other students and shall address specific subjects related to the student's access to facilities and to academic or educational support programs, services, or activities, including, but not limited to, sports and other competitive endeavors. In addition, the Compliance Officer shall identify specific school site employee(s) to whom the student may report any problem related to the student's status as a transgender or gender-nonconforming individual, so that prompt action can be taken to address it. Alternatively, if appropriate and desired by the student, the school may form a support team for the student that will meet periodically to assess whether the arrangements for the student are meeting the student's educational needs and providing



equal access to programs and activities, educate appropriate staff about the student's transition, and serve as a resource to the student to better protect the student from gender-based discrimination.

4. Accessibility to Sex-Segregated Facilities, Programs, and Activities[ 12]: When the district maintains sex-segregated facilities, such as restrooms and locker rooms, or offers sex-segregated programs and activities, such as physical education classes, intermural sports, and interscholastic athletic programs, students shall be permitted to access facilities and participate in programs and activities consistent with their gender identity. To address any student's privacy concerns in using sex-segregated facilities, the district shall offer available options, such as a gender-neutral or single-use restroom or changing area, a bathroom stall with a door, an area in the locker room separated by a curtain or screen, or use of the locker room before or after the other students. However, the district shall not require a student to utilize these options because the student is transgender or gender-nonconforming. In addition, a student shall be permitted to participate in accordance with the student's gender identity in other circumstances where students are separated by gender, such as for class discussions, yearbook pictures, and field trips. A student's right to participate in a sex-segregated activity in accordance with the student's gender identity shall not render invalid or inapplicable any other eligibility rule established for participation in the activity.

5. Student Records: A student's legal name or gender as entered on the mandatory student record required pursuant to 5 CCR 432 shall only be changed with proper documentation. When a student presents government-issued documentation of a name and/or gender change or submits a request for a name and/or gender change through the process specified in Education Code 49070, the district shall update the student's records. (Education Code 49062.5, 49070)

6. Names and Pronouns: If a student so chooses, district personnel shall be required to address the student by a name and the pronouns consistent with the student's gender identity, without the necessity of a court order or a change to the student's official district record. However, inadvertent slips or honest mistakes by district personnel in the use of the student's name and/or consistent pronouns will, in general, not constitute a violation of this administrative regulation or the accompanying district policy.
7. Uniforms/Dress Code: A student has the right to dress in a manner consistent with the student's gender identity, subject to any dress code adopted on a school site.

## **BP 5145.7 Students Sexual Harassment**

The Board of Education is committed to maintaining a safe school environment that is free from harassment and discrimination. The Board prohibits ~~sexual harassment of students at school or at school-sponsored or school-related activities, sexual harassment targeted at any student by anyone.~~ The Board also prohibits retaliatory behavior or action against any person who reports, files a complaint or testifies about, or otherwise supports a complainant in alleging sexual harassment.

The district strongly encourages any student who feels that ~~he/she is~~they are being or ~~has~~have been sexually harassed on school grounds or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity by another student or an adult, or who have experienced off-campus sexual harassment that has a continuing effect on campus to immediately contact the district's Title IX Coordinator/Uniform Complaint Procedure Compliance Officer, his/her/their teacher, the principal, or any other available school employee. Any employee who receives a report or observes any incident of sexual harassment shall notify the district's Title IX Coordinator/Uniform Complaint Procedure Compliance Officer and may notify the principal. Any principal who receives a report or observes an incident of sexual harassment shall notify the district Title IX Coordinator/Uniform Complaint Procedure Compliance Officer. ~~the principal or a district compliance officer.~~

Once notified, the Title IX Coordinator/Uniform Complaint Procedure Compliance Officer shall ensure the report or allegation is addressed through the district's Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71) or Uniform Complaint Procedures (AR 1312.3), as applicable.

Principals are responsible for notifying students and parents/guardians that complaints of sexual harassment can be filed under AR 1312.3 and where to obtain a copy of the procedures.~~

~~(cf. 1312.3 – Uniform Complaint Procedures)~~[ 1]The Superintendent or designee shall inform students and parents/guardians of the district's sexual harassment policy by disseminating it through parent/guardian notifications, publishing it on the district's website, and including it in student and staff handbooks. All district staff shall be trained regarding the policy. The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate actions to reinforce the district's sexual harassment policy.

### **Instruction/Information**

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district students receive age-appropriate information ~~on~~ related to sexual harassment. Such instruction and information shall include:

1. What acts and behavior constitute sexual harassment, including the fact that sexual harassment could occur between people of the same sex and could involve sexual violence.
2. A clear message that students do not have to endure any form of sexual harassment under any circumstance, including harassment because of sexual orientation.
3. Encouragement to report observed incidents of sexual harassment even ~~where~~ when the alleged victim of the harassment has not complained.
4. A clear message that student safety is the district's primary concern, and that any separate rule violation involving an alleged victim or any other person reporting a sexual harassment incident will be addressed separately and will not affect the manner in which the sexual harassment complaint will be received, investigated, or resolved.
5. A clear message that, regardless of a complainant's noncompliance with the writing, timeline, or other formal filing requirements, every sexual harassment allegation that involves a student, whether as the victim of the harassment, reporting party, or respondent, shall be addressed consistent with district's Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71) or Uniform Complaint Procedures (AR 1312.3), as applicable. Information about the district's procedure for investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made
- 5.6. Information about the district's Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71) or Uniform Complaint Procedures (AR 1312.3) for addressing reports of sexual harassment, investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made.
7. Information about the rights of students and parents/guardians to file a civil or criminal complaint, as applicable, including the right to file a civil or criminal complaint during the district's investigation of a sexual harassment complaint.
8. A clear message that, the district will implement supportive measures to ensure a safe school environment for students involved consistent with applicable district procedures. When such interim measures are taken, they shall not disadvantage the complainant or victim of the alleged harassment

### **Disciplinary Actions**

~~Any student who engages indetermined to have engaged in the sexual harassment or sexual violence of anyone at school or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity is in violation of this policy and shall be subject to disciplinary action, which may include suspension and/or expulsion, in accordance with applicable law and District procedures. (Education Code 48900, 48900.2, 48915). For students in grades 4-12, disciplinary action may include suspension and/or expulsion, provided that, in imposing such discipline, the entire circumstances of the incident(s) shall be taken into account.~~

Any prohibited conduct that occurs off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored programs or activities will be regarded as sexual harassment in violation of district policy if it has



a continuing effect on or creates a hostile school environment for the complainant or victim of the conduct.

### **Examples of Sexual Harassment**

Examples of Types of conduct which are prohibited in the district and which may constitute sexual harassment include, but are not limited to:

1. Unwelcome leering, sexual flirtations, or propositions.
2. Unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, verbal abuse, derogatory comments, or sexually degrading descriptions.
3. Graphic verbal comments about an individual's body or overly personal conversation.
4. Sexual jokes, derogatory posters, notes, stories, cartoons, drawings, pictures, obscene gestures, or computer-generated images of a sexual nature.
5. Spreading sexual rumors.
6. Teasing or sexual remarks about students enrolled in a predominantly single-sex class.
7. Massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body.
8. Touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way.
9. Impeding or blocking movements, or any physical interference with school activities when directed at an individual on the basis of sex.
10. Displaying sexually suggestive objects in the educational environment.
11. Sexual assault, sexual battery, or sexual coercion.
12. Electronic communications containing comments, words, or images described above.
13. Any act of retaliation against a student who reports a violation of the district's harassment policy, or participates in the investigation of a sexual harassment complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students and parents/guardians that the district does not discriminate on the basis on sex as required by Title IX and that inquiries about the application of Title IX to the district may be referred to the district’s Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer and/or to the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights, U.S. Department of Education. (34 CFR 106.8)

The district shall notify students and parents/guardians of the name, title, office address, email address, and telephone number of the district’s Title IX Coordinator and UCP Compliance Officer. (34 CFR 106.8)

A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and regulations shall:

1. Be included in the notifications that are sent to parents/guardians at the beginning of each school year. (Education Code 48980; 5 CCR 4917)

4. Be posted in a prominent location on the district and school websites and, when available, on district-supported social media accounts, as applicable, in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students. This shall include the name, title, office address, email address, and telephone number of the employee designated as the district's Title IX Coordinator/Uniform Complaint Procedure Compliance Officer. (Education Code 234.6; 34 CFR 106.8)

- 3.5. Be provided as part of any orientation program conducted for new and continuing students at the time the student is enrolled in the school, and/or at the beginning of each quarter, semester, or summer session. (Education Code 231.5)

- 4.6. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct. (Education Code 231.5)

- 5.7. Be included in any the student handbook provided to students, parents/guardians, employees, or employee organizations. (34 CFR 106.8)

~~Be provided to employees and employee organizations~~[ 7]

The Superintendent or designee shall also post the definition of sex discrimination and harassment as described in Education Code 230, including the rights set forth in Education Code 221.8, in a prominent location on the district's website in a manner that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students. (Education Code 234.6[ 8])

## Reporting Process and Complaints | 9 | Investigation and Resolution

Students (or parents/guardians of students) who believe they (or their student) have experienced or witnessed sexual harassment by a student, an employee, or a third party is strongly encouraged to report the incident to the district's Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer, a teacher, the principal, or any other available school employee. Within one school day after receiving such a report, the principal or other school employee shall forward the report to the district's Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer. All school employees who observe an incident of sexual harassment shall within one school day report it to the district's Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer and may report it to the principal. The report shall be made regardless of whether the alleged victim files a complaint or requests confidentiality. Any student who believes that he/she has been subjected to sexual harassment or who has witnessed sexual harassment is strongly encouraged to report the incident to his/her teacher, the principal, or any other available school employee. Within one school day of receiving such a report, the school employee shall forward the report to the principal or the district's compliance officer identified in AR 1312.3. In addition, any school employee who observes an incident of sexual harassment involving a student shall, within one school day, report his/her observation to the principal or a district compliance officer. The employee shall take these actions, whether or not the alleged victim files a complaint.

When a report of sexual harassment involves off-campus conduct, the Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer shall assess whether the conduct may create or contribute to the creation of a hostile school environment. If the Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer determines that a hostile environment may be created, the allegations shall be addressed consistent with Uniform Complaint Procedures (AR 1312.3) or Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71), as applicable.

In any case of sexual harassment involving the principal, compliance officer, or any other person to whom the incident would ordinarily be reported or filed, the report may instead be submitted the Superintendent or designee.

(cf. 5141.4 - Child Abuse Prevention and Reporting)

When a verbal or informal report of sexual harassment is submitted, the principal or compliance officer-Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer shall inform the student or parent/guardian of the right to file a formal written complaint in accordance with the applicable district's uniform complaint procedures.

If a complaint of sexual harassment is initially submitted to the principal, he/she shall, within two school days, forward the report to the compliance officer to initiate investigation of the complaint. The compliance officer shall contact the complainant and investigate and resolve the complaint in accordance with law and district procedures specified in AR 1312.3.

### Complaint Procedures

All complaints of sexual harassment by and against students shall be processed in accordance with applicable law and district procedures. The Title IX Coordinator/UCP Compliance Officer shall review the allegations to determine the applicable procedure for responding to the complaint. All complaints that meet the definition of sexual harassment under Title IX shall be addressed pursuant to the district's Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures (AR 5145.71) and applicable law. Other sexual harassment complaints shall be addressed pursuant to Uniform Complaint Procedures (BP/AR 1312.3) and applicable law.

### Confidentiality [ 10 ]

~~All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential except as necessary to carry out the investigation or take other subsequent necessary action. (5 CCR 4964)~~

~~However, when a complainant or victim of sexual harassment notifies the district of the harassment but requests confidentiality, the compliance officer shall inform him/her that the request may limit the district's ability to investigate the harassment or take other necessary action. When honoring a request for confidentiality, the district will nevertheless take all reasonable steps to investigate and respond to the complaint consistent with the request.~~

~~When a complainant or victim of sexual harassment notifies the district of the harassment but requests that the district not pursue an investigation, the district will determine whether or not it can honor such a request while still providing a safe and nondiscriminatory environment for all students.~~

### Response Pending Investigation

~~When an incident of sexual harassment is reported, the principal or designee, in consultation with the compliance officer, shall determine whether interim measures are necessary pending the results of the investigation. The principal/designee or compliance officer shall take immediate measures necessary to stop the harassment and protect students and/or ensure their access to the educational program. Such measures may include placing the individuals involved in separate classes or transferring a student to a class taught by a different teacher, in accordance with law and Board policy. The school should notify the individual who was harassed of his/her options to avoid contact with the alleged harasser and allow the complainant to change academic and extracurricular arrangements as appropriate. The school should also ensure that the complainant is aware of the resources and assistance, such as counseling, that are available to him/her. As appropriate, such actions shall be considered even when a student chooses to not file a formal complaint or the sexual harassment occurs off school grounds or outside school sponsored or school-related programs or activities.~~

APPROVING ROUTINE BUDGET REVISIONS**

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**DISCUSSION:** Routine budget revisions are brought before the Board for approval monthly. The items below detail the changes and movement between accounts.

Each year, after submitting the previous year final financial statements, certain prior year revenues are added to the current year budget because they cannot be recognized other than in the year in which they are actually spent. The significant increase in revenues recorded in September reflect this required accounting treatment.

**Revenues**

Other State Revenues –

Other State revenues are increased \$3,439 because of prior year unearned revenue in the TUPE grant.

Federal Revenues –

Federal revenues are increased \$5,165,860 primarily because of the addition of prior year unearned revenue.

Other Local Revenues –

Other Local revenues are increased \$292,546 primarily because of local donations, including \$25,000 from the SRVEF Endowment fund.

\*Each year, after submitting the previous year final financial statements, expenditure budgets are increased as a recognition of funds that were unspent in the prior year and, therefore, made available in the current year. These funds are referred to as carry over and are generally made up of site discretionary and local donation funds, and restricted programs.

**Expenditures**

Salaries and Benefits –

Salaries and benefits are increased \$1,050,741 primarily because of the addition of Technology Liaisons and prior year carry over distribution.

Supplies/Services –

Supplies and services are increased \$9,144,499 primarily because of local Donations and prior year carry over distribution.

Capital Outlay –

Capital Outlay is increased \$87,228 because of Routine Restricted Maintenance and Vocational Education program expenses.

**Child Nutrition Fund 13 –**

Income and expense projections are reduced \$24,479. The projected ending balance remains unchanged at \$228,495.

**Special Reserve Fund 17 –**

The Special Reserve Fund beginning balance is decreased \$121,333 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending fund balance is \$16,393,413.

**Building Fund 21 –**

The Building Fund beginning balance is increased \$18,587,380 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending balance is \$19,094,697.

**Capital Facilities Fund 25 –**

The Capital Facilities Fund beginning balance is increased \$1,376,800 to reflect the prior year ending fund balance. The projected ending balance is \$6,224,056.

**Reserve for Capital Outlay Fund 40 –**

The Reserve for Capital Outlay Fund beginning balance is increased \$257,921 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending balance is \$11,461,471.

**Bond Interest and Redemption fund –**

The Bond Interest and Redemption fund beginning balance is increased \$4,117,420 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending balance is \$49,451,568.

**Self Insurance Fund –**

The Self Insurance fund beginning balance is increased \$137,098 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending balance is \$3,735,654.

**Retiree Health Benefit Fund –**

The Retiree Benefit fund beginning balance is increased \$7,717,722 to reflect the prior year ending balance. The projected ending balance is \$34,783,706.

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**RECOMMENDATION:**




**TOPIC:**       **DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY**

**DISCUSSION:**

Contra Costa County receives funds from the California Department of Education to administer State Preschool services to program eligible children and families within Contra Contra County. The county has partnered with the school district to fund 48 slots for program eligible children who receive school district services.

In accordance with the contract provisions for the county/state funded program and receiving federal grant funds for the preschool program, the district is required to conduct and provide an annual audit and financial report conforming to the requirements set forth in the Code of Regulations, Title 2, Part 200, Subpart F. As such the District has contracted with EideBailly, an accountancy corporation licensed by the State Board of Accountancy, for an audit of the District's California State Preschool Program.

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
