Welcome to the San Ramon Valley Unified School District Board of Education meeting. Your interest in our schools is greatly appreciated.

The Board Members value input from the community. Members of the public can address the Board at meetings regarding items that are not on the agenda during the agenda item *Public Comment for Non-Agendized Items*. yltems that are on the agenda can be addressed when that item is introduced by the Board President.

In order to ensure that the Board has adequate time to hear from the public while balancing the need to conduct its agendized work, public comment will be handled in the following way:

- A time limit of three (3) minutes per speaker has been established and will be enforced. The Board
 reserves the right to decrease the amount of time allotted per speaker. All speakers will be allotted an
 equal amount of time.
- Comments for special meetings and workshops will be limited to the agenda item only.

Public Comment for both Agendized and Non-Agendized Items:

- Anyone who wishes to address the board must submit a Speaker Card to Cindy Fischer
- The Board President will call each speaker to the podium during the appropriate agenda item.
- Please note that, by law, the Board cannot take action or engage in dialogue on items not on the agenda.

For Items Not on the Agenda:

- A maximum of thirty minutes will be allotted for the agenda item: Public Comment for Non-Agendized Items.
- If the amount of time needed for all speakers to be heard exceeds the thirty minutes allotted, then Public
 Comment for Non-Agendized Items will be paused at the thirty minute mark and will be continue prior to
 agenda items: Administrative Matters until all remaining speakers whose cards were submitted before the
 pause have had an opportunity to be heard.
- When there is a topic that only one speaker wishes to address, that speaker will be prioritized.
- We strongly encourage speakers who wish to speak about the same topic to designate one or two
 individuals to speak on behalf of the entire group.
- If there are any people who share a unified view of a topic, they may raise their hand or stand while the
 designated speakers are addressing the Board so that the Board Members are aware of the level of
 support.

By law, board members can only discuss items that appear on the agenda. For this reason, board members do not engage in dialogue with individuals speaking during the non-agenda public comment section of the meeting. For individuals who wish to speak with board members in-depth about an issue, contacting board members on an individual basis is recommended, although individual board members have no legal authority to make decisions without consideration by the whole board.

- 1. Email your comments to <u>publiccomments@srvusd.net</u>. Emails will be automatically forwarded to each Board Member and will be entered into the official minutes.
 - a. Public comments received from the time the agenda is posted through the end of the open session portion of the meeting, will be included in the minutes.
 - b. Public comments received 4 hours or less prior to the start of open session will be included in the minutes, but may not be read by all Board Members prior to the meeting.
 - c. No email attachments will be accepted with electronically submitted public comments.
 - d. Email addresses will not be included in the public record in order to protect the privacy of commenters.

Closed Session: Closed session meetings are not open to the public. By law, matters dealing with students and district employees are reserved for closed session to provide confidentiality. Other closed session topics can include litigation, property negotiations, and collective bargaining issues with employee associations. Members of the public are given the opportunity to speak regarding closed session items prior to the closed session.

Action items are considered and voted on individually by the board. **Consent items** are considered routine in nature and are approved by combining them into a single vote. A member of the Board of Education or a member of the public may request that a consent item be removed from the consent agenda and voted on separately.

TOPIC: SRVUSD STRATEGIC DIRECTION: SHARED LEADERSHIP BOARD REPORT

This report and the presentation at the Board Meeting are intended to provide an outline and information about our Strategic Direction Shared Leadership plan for the 2022-23 school year. Shared Leadership is one of the primary tenets of our Strategic Directions. We will create the conditions for shared leadership by building a culture of trust, collegiality, and shared responsibility with students, staff, and families, working with our district steering committees and honoring our commitment to including student advisory committees.

The SRVUSD Shared Leadership Strategic Direction has several goals. First, cultivate a culture of collective responsibility and shared investment in the success of each of our students. Second, engage in collaborative decision-making with students, staff, and families. Third, continue to develop and improve relational trust amongst all stakeholders.

To meet these Shared Leadership goals SRVUSD has several strategies, actions and measurements in place for the 2022-23 school year.

Shared Leadership Strategies, Actions and Measurements:

Our first strategy is to increase efforts to include student voice in all areas of decision-making, particularly the voice of underrepresented students. We plan on doing this by continuing to expand the opportunities for students to share their experiences through the California Healthy Kids Survey and student voice surveys. We will expand the use of deep learning strategies including incorporating more choice and voice in the curriculum. Regular classroom walkthroughs will provide a measurement of success throughout the school year.

Our second strategy is to increase effort to continue to support leaders in engaging parents, students and staff with school and District cycles of improvement. We plan on doing this by increasing parent and student participation in the decision-making processes as measured by survey instruments. Additionally, we will continue to support leaders in engaging the community in school and District improvement efforts. Specifically to create the opportunity to create synergy and codesign with our staff, community, parents, and students.

Our third strategy is to develop opportunities to grow and nourish new and existing leaders. The District is committed to developing the leadership skills and capacity of current and new administrators while growing our own teacher leaders who aspire to assume leadership roles at the site and District level and who are considering pursuing an administrative credential. We plan on measuring this by increasing the percentage of aspiring leaders who complete our program. Additionally, new and existing leaders would provide feedback after each leadership learning session.

There are three identified levels of leadership development: aspiring leaders, new SRVUSD leaders, and current SRVUSD leaders.

Aspiring leaders will be offered intentional professional development providing leadership opportunities. The professional development will aid in identifying employees who exhibit leadership

interest and potential. It will also broaden the pool of internal, qualified candidates for management positions. The District plans to fund a portion of tuition for ten (10) aspiring leaders to participate in the Contra Costa County Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Program (PASC). Aspiring leaders would be selected through an application and interview process.

New SRVUSD leaders will be provided leadership training specific to the philosophy, programs, procedures and issues of the SRVUSD. Participants will be given the opportunity to explore their future professional goals. Current SRVUSD leaders will be given opportunities to learn and practice through quarterly leadership symposia, leadership book clubs, feedback sessions, and deeper professional development.

It is important that we are able to not only measure the progress we are making toward our goals but also clearly communicate this information.

One way to communicate progress toward goals is through the use of a District Data Dashboard. While California has the California School Dashboard, which is useful, it is only updated once a year and does not necessarily focus on the specific goals we have established for SRVUSD.

The purpose of this report is to provide initial information to the Board on SRVUSD's Data Dashboard. We will then create a draft of the dashboard based on Board feedback to bring to the September Board meeting.

In this initial iteration of the dashboard, we are proposing that it contains three overarching categories that are linked to the strategic directions: a) Deep Learning and Innovation, b) Equitable, Inclusive, and Safe Learning Environments, and c) Organizational Excellence. Each category has three dimensions and each dimension has one to two indicators. Below is a general outline:

Deep Learning and Innovation

Dimension One. College and Career Readiness

Indicator: Increase use of deep learning strategies in classrooms and finalize the *Profile of a Learner*.

Dimension Two. English Language Arts

Indicator: Increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding standards on CAASPP. *Indicator*: Decrease academic disparities for underrepresented students on CAASPP.

Dimension Three. Mathematics

Indicator: Increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding standards on CAASPP. *Indicator*: Decrease academic disparities for underrepresented students on CAASPP.

Equitable, Inclusive, and Safe Learning Environments

Dimension One. Social Emotional Well-Being

Indicator: Improve students' social emotional well-being as measured by the California Healthy Kids Survey.

<u>Dimension Two. Student Voice and Agency</u>

Indicator: Increase percentage of students who feel they are meaningfully participating in school activities as measured by California Healthy Kids Survey.

Indicator: Increase inclusive classroom experiences that allow student choice and voice.

Dimension Three. Diversifying Staff

Indicator: Increase the percentage of people of color as new hires.

Indicator: Decrease the percentage of employees of color who leave the district due to job dissatisfaction.

Organizational Excellence

<u>Dimension One. Stewardship of Resources</u>

Indicator: Positive certification on the interim budget report.

<u>Dimension Two.</u> Culture of Responsiveness

Indicator: Improve parent satisfaction with district responsiveness. *Indicator*: Improve staff satisfaction with district responsiveness.

Dimension Three. Shared Leadership

Indicator: Increase the percentage of aspiring leaders who complete the Leadership

Development Program.

Indicator: Increase the participation of community partners in the decision-making process.

At the September Board meeting we will present a draft of this dashboard. It will contain measurements associated with each indicator. Each measurement will contain both a baseline and a target goal for what we want to achieve by the end of the 2022-2023 school year.

IN SUPPORT OF MARCH 2023 AS PRESCRIPTION DRUG ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: When used as prescribed by a doctor, prescription medicines such as stimulants, sedatives and opioids can be helpful in treating many illnesses, but when these medications are misused, they can have serious consequences such as an increased risk of infectious disease and overdose death;

WHEREAS: Anyone who takes prescription opioids can become addicted to them. In fact, as many as one in four patients receiving long-term opioid therapy in a primary care setting struggles with opioid addiction. Once addicted, it can be hard to stop;

WHEREAS: Prescription opioid overdose deaths also often involve benzodiazepines. Benzodiazepines are central nervous system depressants used to sedate, induce sleep, prevent seizures, and relieve anxiety. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends avoiding taking benzodiazepines while taking prescription opioids whenever possible¹;

WHEREAS: In 2021 in Contra Costa County there were 498,097 opioid prescriptions given to patients which is an age-adjusted rate of 355.5 per 1,000 residents, compared to the state rate of 326.7²;

WHEREAS: In 2021, a total of 19,978 emergency department visits occurred in California that were related to any opioid overdose and 343 of those visits occurred in Contra Costa County²;

WHEREAS: Overdose deaths involving synthetic opioids other than methadone, which largely consist of illicitly manufactured fentanyl; psychostimulants with abuse potential (e.g., methamphetamine); and cocaine have increased in recent years necessitating response efforts focused on polysubstance use; and

WHEREAS: The San Ramon Valley Unified School District supports October 29, 2022 and April 27, 2023 as "National Prescription Drug Take Back Days" as declared by the DEA⁴ and encourages residents to locate their local collection site and safely dispose of their accumulated unwanted, unused prescription drugs;

WHEREAS: The Contra Costa County Medication Education and Disposal Safety (MEDS) Coalition³ engages youth and adult stakeholders from across the county to participate in Prescription Drug Abuse Awareness Month activities to raise awareness about prescription drug dangers, promote safe medication storage and disposal and ensure naloxone is available for those at high risk of overdose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Governing Board of the San Ramon Valley Unified School District hereby declare the month of March, 2023 as Prescription Drug Abuse Awareness Month, and encourages all citizens to participate in prescription drug abuse related prevention programs and activities. TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF SCHOOL FACILITY FEE JUSTIFICATION REPORT JUSTIFYING

AN INCREASE IN LEVEL 1 STATUTORY SCHOOL FACILITY/DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES

DISCUSSION: The Level 1 statutory school facility fees are authorized by the State Allocation Board (SAB) and apply to new residential and commercial/industrial construction within a school district. Level 1 fees are adjusted every two years according to the inflation rate for Class B construction as determined by the SAB.

On February 23, 2022, the SAB increased the statutory Level 1 fees by 17.45 percent to \$4.79 per square foot for residential construction and \$0.78 per square foot for commercial/industrial construction. In order to collect either Level 1 fees, or the higher Level 2 fees, school districts must first prepare and adopt a fee justification report for Level 1 or a School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) for Level 2. School Facility Consultants prepared the School Facility Fee Justification Report, dated May 2022 justifying the district's ability to increase Level 1 fees.

State law gives school districts the authority to charge fees on new residential and commercial/industrial developments if those developments generate additional students and cause a need for additional school facilities. Government Code Section 65995 authorizes school districts to collect fees on future development to the maximum amount as set by the SAB. Government Code Section 66001 requires that a reasonable relationship exists between the amount and use of the fees and the development on which the fees are to be charged. The School Facility Fee Justification Report dated May 2022 identifies the cost of providing school facilities for students generated by future residential and commercial/industrial development in order to justify the collection of fees on those developments and the report explains the relationship between the fees and the developments on which those fees are to be charged.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Governing Board adopt the School Facility Fee Justification Report, dated May 2022.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: This increase will result in an increase in school facility/development impact fee revenue for residential, commercial, industrial and senior housing development.

TOPIC: PUBLIC HEARING ON THE ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 6/22-23, ESTABLISHING AN INCREASE

TO THE LEVEL 1 SCHOOL FACILITY/DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES

DISCUSSION: At its February 23, 2022 meeting, the State Allocation Board increased the maximum fee for residential construction fees to \$4.79 per square foot. It also increased commercial/industrial and senior housing construction to \$.78 per square foot. The previous rates were \$3.79 and \$.61 respectively.

School Facility Consultants prepared the School Facility Fee Justification Report, dated May 2022 ("Report") justifying the district's ability to increase Level 1 fees.

State law gives school districts the authority to charge fees on new residential and commercial/industrial developments if those developments generate additional students and cause a need for additional school facilities. Government Code Section 65995 authorizes school districts to collect fees on future development to the maximum amount as set by the SAB. Government Code Section 66001 requires that a reasonable relationship exists between the amount and use of the fees and the development on which the fees are to be charged. The Report identifies the cost of providing school facilities for students generated by future residential and commercial/industrial development in order to justify the collection of fees on those developments and the report explains the relationship between the fees and the developments on which those fees are to be charged.

Notice of consideration of the increased school fees has been published in accordance with applicable legal requirements.

If Resolution No. 6/22-23 is approved the adjusted residential, commercial/industrial and senior housing development fees will become effective 60 days after the Board takes action, which is October 15, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION: The Board President should conduct a public hearing at this time.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: This increase will result in an increase in school facility/development impact fee revenue for residential, commercial, industrial and senior housing development.

TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 6/22-23, ESTABLISHING AN INCREASE TO THE LEVEL 1

SCHOOL FACILITY/DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES

DISCUSSION: Education code states that the governing board of any school district is authorized to levy a fee, charge, dedication or other requirement against any construction within the boundaries of the District for the purpose of funding the construction or reconstruction of school facilities, more commonly known as "developer fees". A "fee justification study" is required to document the District's need for the fee. This action will allow the District to change the maximum allowable Level 1 fee as recently approved by the State Allocation Board.

There are three levels of fees that a school district can levy. They are:

Level 1 –at its February 23, 2022 meeting, the State Allocation Board increased the maximum fee authorized by Education Code Section 17620 to \$4.79 per square foot of residential construction described in Government Code Section 65995(b)(1) and \$0.78 per square foot against commercial and industrial construction and senior housing described in Government Code Section 65995(b)(2).

Level 2 - if the District is eligible, it can also levy a higher amount on residential construction in lieu of the \$4.79 Level 1 fee. This higher fee is referred to as a Level 2 Fee, and a district must comply with certain eligibility requirements including a "School Facilities Needs Analysis" which is required to document the district's need for this level.

Level 3 - if state funds are deemed to be unavailable for school facilities, then the District may be eligible to levy a Level 3 fee in lieu of Level 1 & 2 fees on residential construction. Again, the District's need for a Level 3 fee would be assessed in a "School Facilities Needs Analysis."

The District's updated School Facility Fee Justification Report as prepared by our consultant, School Facility Consultants, supports the increased Level 1 fee as authorized by the Education Code. The attached Resolution No. 6/22-23 is required to implement the increase.

RECOMMENDATION: The staff recommends the Board adopt Resolution No. 6/22-23, establishing an increase to the Level 1 School Facility fees.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: This increase will result in an increase in school facility/development impact fee revenue from residential, commercial, industrial and senior housing construction.

RESOLUTION NO.: 6/22-23

IN SUPPORT OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 6/22-23, ESTABLISHING AN INCREASE TO THE LEVEL 1 SCHOOL FACILITY/DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES

WHEREAS, the Governing Board ("Board") of the San Ramon Valley School District ("District") provides for the educational needs for students in grades TK through 12 within portions of the City of San Ramon and the Town of Danville ("City") and a portion of the unincorporated Contra Costa County ("County"); and

WHEREAS, Statute AB 2926 (Chapter 887/ Statutes 1986) authorizes the governing board of any school district to levy a fee, charge, dedication or other form of requirement against any development project for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities; and,

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 65995 establishes a maximum amount of fee that may be charged against such development projects and authorizes the maximum amount set forth in said section to be adjusted for inflation every two years as set forth in the state-wide cost index for Class B construction as determined by the State Allocation Board at its February 23, 2022 meeting; and,

WHEREAS, at its February 23, 2022 meeting, the State Allocation Board increased the maximum fee authorized by Education Code Section 17620 to \$4.79 per square foot of residential construction described in Government Code Section 65995(b)(1) and \$0.78 per square foot against commercial and industrial construction (except for rental self-storage, which shall be levied in the amount of \$0.12 per square foot)described in Government Code Section 65995(b)(2); and,

WHEREAS, aging schools within the District have an impact on the District's ability to provide an adequate quality education and negatively impact the educational opportunities for the District's students; and

WHEREAS, the District has analyzed prior studies in conjunction with the adoption and increase of school impact fees existing prior to this resolution, and annually reviews an accounting of the amount of fees collected, and such studies and accountings are incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the District does not have sufficient funds available for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities needed to accommodate students from residential and commercial/industrial construction; and

WHEREAS, School Facility Consultants prepared and the Board received and considered a report entitled, "School Facility Fee Justification Report, dated May 2022" ("Report"), which carefully evaluated the assumptions underlying the fee calculation and the amount of the fee to be collected, and contains the documentation, and analysis of the School Facilities needs of the District, including: (a) the purpose of the fees; (b) the use to which the fees are to be put; (c) a determination of the impact of the increased number of employees anticipated to result from the commercial/industrial construction (by category) upon the cost of providing school facilities within the District; (d) an evaluation and projection of the number of students that will be generated by residential construction; (e) the anticipated new

school facilities that will be required to serve such students; and (f) the cost of such school facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Report contains information demonstrating a nexus (roughly proportional and reasonable relationship) between the residential and commercial/industrial construction and: (1) the use for fees, (2) the need for school facilities, (3) the cost of school facilities, and (4) the amount of fees from residential and commercial/industrial construction; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to approve and adopt fees on residential projects in the amount of \$4.79 per square foot as authorized by Education Code Section 17620; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to approve and adopt fees on commercial and industrial development in the amount of \$0.78 per square foot as described in Government Code Section 65995 (b)(2), except for rental self-storage, which shall be levied in the amount of \$0.12 per square foot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Governing Board of the San Ramon Valley Unified School District as follows:

- 1. Procedure. This Board hereby finds that prior to the adoption of this Resolution, the Board conducted a public hearing to allow for any oral or written presentations to be made, as part of the Board's regularly scheduled August 16, 2022 meeting. Notice of the time and place of the meeting, including a general explanation of the matter to be considered, has been published twice in a newspaper in accordance with Government Code Section 54994.1. Additionally, at least 30 days prior to the meeting, the District posted notice of the public hearing where the Report will be adopted and made available to the public a copy of the Report, which included data indicating the amount of the cost, or estimated cost, required to provide the service for which the fee or service charge is to be adjusted pursuant to this Resolution, and the revenue sources anticipated to provide this service, and all notices have been given in accordance with applicable law.
- 2. Findings. The Board has reviewed, the Report as it relates to proposed and potential development, the resulting school facilities' needs, the cost thereof, and the available sources of revenue including the fees provided by this Resolution, and based thereon and upon all other written and oral presentations to the Board, hereby makes the following findings:
 - A. That the Board hereby accepts and adopts the Report, which is incorporated herein by reference.
 - B. Enrollment at the District school(s) is presently at ninety-four percent of capacity. However, the District is currently operating over capacity at the 9-12 grade level and does not have available existing facilities to house students generated by future residential developments;
 - C. Additional development projects within the District, whether new residential construction or residential reconstruction involving increases in assessable area greater than 500 square feet, or new commercial and industrial construction will increase the need for school facilities and/or the need for reconstruction of school facilities.
 - D. Without the addition of new school facilities, and/or reconstruction of present school facilities, any further residential development projects or commercial or industrial development projects within the District will result in a significant decrease in the quality of education presently offered by the District;

- E. The District does not have sufficient funds available for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities needed to accommodate students from the anticipated residential and commercial/industrial construction; and
- F. Substantial residential development, commercial and industrial development is projected within the District's boundaries and the enrollment produced thereby will exceed the capacity of the schools of the District in areas of growth. As a result, conditions of overcrowding may exist within the District, which will impair the normal functioning of the District's educational programs;
- G. The fees proposed in the Report and the fees implemented pursuant to this Resolution are for the purposes of providing adequate school facilities to maintain the quality of education offered by the District, to serve the students generated by the residential construction on which the fees are imposed;
- H. The fees proposed in the Report and implemented pursuant to this Resolution will be used for the construction and/or reconstruction of school facilities as identified in the Report. Such uses shall include but not necessarily be limited to construction or acquisition of additional school facilities, remodeling or modernizing existing school facilities, acquiring and installing additional portable classrooms and related school facilities, as well as any required central administrative and support facilities within the District and any other use specified in the Report, or permitted by law.;
- The uses of the fees proposed in the Report and implemented pursuant to this Resolution are reasonably related to the types of development projects on which the fees are imposed;
- J. The fees proposed in the Report and implemented pursuant to this Resolution bear a reasonable relationship to the need for school facilities created by the types of development projects on which the fees are imposed because the Report demonstrates that the increase in student enrollment resulting from such development will necessitate the construction or reconstruction of school facilities to accommodate such growth;
- K. The fees proposed in the Report and implemented pursuant to this Resolution do not exceed the estimated amount required to provide funding for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities for which the fees are levied; and in making this finding, the Board declares that it has considered the availability of revenue sources anticipated to provide such facilities, including general fund revenues;
- L. The fees imposed on commercial or industrial development bear a reasonable relationship and are limited to the needs of the community for schools and are reasonably related and limited to the need for school facilities caused by the development;
- M. The fees will be collected for school facilities for which an account has been established and funds appropriated and for which the district has adopted a construction schedule and/or to reimburse the District for expenditures previously made.
- 3. Fee. Based upon the foregoing findings, the Board hereby increases the previously levied fee to the amount of \$4.79 per square foot for assessable space for new residential construction and for residential reconstruction to the extent of the resulting increase in assessable areas and to the amount of \$0.78 per square foot for new commercial and industrial construction except for rental self-storage, which shall be levied in the amount of \$0.12 per square foot.
- 4. Fee Adjustments and Limitation. The fees adjusted herewith shall be subject to the following:

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A. To the extent the District wishes to increase the fee, the amount of the District's fees as authorized by Education Code Section 17620 shall be reviewed every two years to determine if a fee increase according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for Class B construction as determined by the State Allocation Board is justified.

- B. Any development project for which a final map was approved and construction had commenced on or before September 1, 1986, is subject only to the fee, charge, dedication or other form of requirement in existence on that date and applicable to the project.
- C. The term "development project" as used herein is as defined by Section 65928 of the Government Code.
- 5. Additional Mitigation Methods. The policies set forth in this Resolution are not exclusive and the Board reserves the authority to undertake other or additional methods to finance school facilities including but not limited to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982 (Government Code Section 53311, et seq.) and such other funding mechanisms. This Board reserves the authority to substitute the dedication of land or other property or other form of requirement in lieu of the fees levied by way of this Resolution at its discretion, so long as the reasonable value of land to be dedicated does not exceed the maximum fee amounts contained herein or modified pursuant hereto.
- 6. Implementation. For residential, commercial and industrial projects within the District, the Superintendent, or the Superintendent's designee, is authorized to issue Certificates of Compliance upon the payment of any fee levied under the authority of this Resolution. In the event a Certificate of Compliance is issued for the payment of fees for a development project, mobile home or manufactured home and it is later determined that the statement or other representation made by an authorized party concerning the development project as to square footage is untrue or in the event the zoning is declared invalid, then such Certificate of Compliance shall automatically terminate, and the appropriate City, County or the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development ("OSHPD") shall be so notified.
- 7. California Environmental Quality Act. The Board hereby finds that the implementation of Developer Fees is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).
- 8. Commencement Date. The effective date of the increase in fees shall be October 15, 2022, which is 60 days following adoption of this Resolution by the Board.
- 9. Notification of Local Agencies. The Secretary of the Board is hereby directed to forward copies of this Resolution and a map of the district to the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County and to the Planning Commission and City Council of the City of San Ramon and the Town of Danville.
- 10. Severability. If any portion of this Resolution is found by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such finding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution. The Board hereby declares its intent to adopt this Resolution irrespective of the fact that one or more of its provisions may be declared invalid subsequent hereto.
- 11. Other Fees. In the event that the Board takes action in the future to adopt an alternative fee pursuant to Government Code section 65995.5 or 65995.7, commonly known as "Level 2" or "Level 3" fees, respectively, in an amount greater than that authorized by this Resolution, this Resolution shall be held in abeyance during the time in which the greater Level 2 or Level 3 fee is authorized. If, for any reason, any future Board action to adopt a greater Level 2 or Level 3 fee

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ceases to be effective, this Resolution shall then immediately return into effect unless otherwise specified by the Board.

12. Appeal. The Board hereby adopts and establishes the procedures that permit the party against whom the Commercial/Industrial Fees are imposed the opportunity for a hearing to appeal that imposition of Commercial/Industrial Fees for commercial/industrial construction as stated in Education Code section 17621 and Government Code section 66020 and 66021.

TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION #22/22-23, APPROVING BUDGET REVISIONS DUE TO ADOPTION OF THE 2022-23 STATE BUDGET AND APPROVING ROUTINE BUDGET REVISIONS

DISCUSSION: Routine budget revisions are brought before the Board for approval monthly. The items below detail the changes and movement between accounts.

*Budget revisions reflecting revenues and expenses that were not known at the time the district budget was adopted are presented to the Board within forty-five days of the state budget adoption. Other routine adjustments are also presented at this time.

Revenues

LCFF/Other State

LCFF and Other State revenues increased \$48,828,792. Of that amount, \$19,109,858 is because of increased LCFF funding related to base augmentation and increased transitional kindergarten requirements, \$3,800,000 is because of new Home-to-School Transportation funding, \$5,760,000 from the Learning Recovery Emergency Block Grant, \$18,063,000 from the Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials Discretionary Block Grant, \$123,510 is an adjustment to Special Education funding, \$267,100 is an adjustment to Lottery projections, and \$1,705,324 is because of increased funding for the Extended Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP).

Other Local Revenues -

Other Local revenues increased \$20,788 because of new projections for external billings.

*On a monthly basis, expenditure budgets are reviewed and adjusted to reflect projections based on new information such as grant awards, local donations, and district expenditure commitments.

Expenditures

Salaries and Benefits -

Salaries and benefits increased \$1,200,310 primarily due to the implementation of the Equity Liaison (Instructional Coaches).

Supplies/Services -

Supplies and services increased \$1,600,305 due to ELOP, Lottery instructional materials, security cameras, and other miscellaneous increases.

Capital Outlay -

Capital Outlay is increased \$500,000 for vehicle purchases.

Building Fund 21 -

Transfers In are increased \$3,602,868 due to a reimbursement from OPSC for a project at Montevideo Elementary. The projected ending balance is \$10,526,261.

County School Facilities Fund 35 -

Income and expenditures are increased \$3,602,868. The projected ending balance remains unchanged at \$0.

State Budget Process

 Education Code Section 42127(h) requires districts to make public any revisions to revenues and expenditures from its Adopted Budget within 45 days from enactment

The State Budget was adopted on June 27, 2022:

Major K-12 Funding Provisions in the State Budget

Future SRVUSD Budget Considerations

- Not all of our new revenues are the same:
- some are one-time and some are restricted for particular purposes
- SRVUSD is still experiencing declining enrollment in certain neighborhoods
- Possibility of an economic recession is real:
- This will likely lead to a COLA only environment with few new funds from the state being available

Future SRVUSD Budget Considerations

- Spending commitments need to be evaluated:
- Previous commitments like the "Bridge" enhancements were included in this year's budget (i.e. lower counselor and nursing ratios, lower class size, and caseload caps; approx. \$2.8M annually)
- counselors, MTSS liaisons, intervention paras; approx. \$7M annually) Recent commitments using one-time COVID dollars (i.e. elementary
- Future commitments to services identified as part of the Access to Excellence roadmap
- Ongoing efforts to attract and retain the best staff in an severe inflationary environment, coupled with increased competition from surrounding employers

Next Steps and Timeline

- August 16: "45 Day Budget Revision" to align the SRVUSD district budget with the state budget
- August to October: review actual enrollment, ADA, payroll, other expenditures
- September 20: SRVUSD Unaudited Actuals 2021-22

TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST TO ADJUST THE DAILY RATES OF PAY FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

DISCUSSION: The San Ramon Valley Unified School District has been challenged for the several years by the ongoing shortage of substitute teachers. Many school districts, including San Ramon Valley, increased their daily rates of pay for substitutes over the last two years as a strategy to recruit and retain them for service with their students.

Many local districts are in the process of altering their daily rates of pay for the coming school year to ensure their substitute needs for 2022-2023 are met. Accordingly, to recruit and retain a sufficient pool of quality substitute teachers to satisfy daily needs and remain competitive locally, staff recommends that the daily rates of pay for certificated substitutes be adjusted as follows for the 2022-2023 school year:

Daily Substitutes		Retirees	
1-20 Days	\$225	1-20 Days	\$250
21-60 Days	\$250	21+ Days	\$275
61+ Days	\$275		

Staff further recommends that substitute teachers who work on Mondays and Fridays, our highest need days for substitutes, and those covering Special Day Class Assignments, be paid an additional \$25 for services rendered.

Staff will reassess the market rates for substitute teachers in Summer 2023 and recommend then whether these rates should remain in place or be further altered for the 2023-2024 school year.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve an increase in the daily rates of pay for substitute teachers as indicated above for the 2022-2023 school year.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: It is estimated that this increase in pay rates for substitute teachers will result in increased, one-time costs to the General Fund of roughly \$1,000,000 in the 2022-2023 school year.

TAX OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION #26/22-23, AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY CONTRACT(S) RELATED TO WATER DAMAGE AT CREEKSIDE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

DISCUSSION: On June 28, 2022, an underground fire sprinkler riser ruptured at Creekside Elementary School causing major damage to the interior and exterior of the district owned childcare building. The major flooding underground created an upward pressure of water which caused the concrete slab to bow, crack and separate, damaging the slab and the integrity of the building structure beyond reasonable repair. Due to the extensive damage the cost of repairs is estimated at \$800,000, pending further evaluations by an engineer.

It is critical that the work be repaired as quickly as possible. Public Contract Code allows contracting without bidding under these circumstances, provided a resolution by the board, by unanimous vote and the approval of the County Superintendent of Schools.

RECOMMENDATION: The Administration recommends the adoption of resolution 26/22-23, Authorizing emergency contracts related to water damage at Creekside Elementary School.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: Damage is estimated at \$800,000, the district's portion will be \$50,000 deducted from Self-Insurance Fund, and the remaining amount will be covered by the district's property insurance carrier.

WHEREAS, on June 28, 2022, a water line burst at Creekside Elementary School("Site") flooding the childcare building and causing major damage to the floor and structure,

WHEREAS, the water damage ("Emergency Event") constituted a sudden, unexpected occurrence that required immediate action for clean-up and repair; and

WHEREAS, the District is informed and believes that the cost to repair and replace items is more than \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, California Public Contract Code ("PCC") Section 20113 provides that in an emergency when any repairs, alterations, work, or improvement is necessary to any facility of public schools to permit the continuance of existing school classes, or to avoid danger to life or property, the Board may, by unanimous vote, with the approval of the County Superintendent, make a contract in writing or otherwise on behalf of the District for the performance of labor, furnishing of materials or supplies for the purpose without advertising for or inviting bids.

WHEREAS, immediate action must be taken by the District to enter into contracts with contractors to repair and restore the affected room(s); and

WHEREAS, the emergency events repair work must be performed without delay to respond to the emergency and to minimize as quickly as possible the impact on occupants, including both students and administration;

NOW THEREFORE, the Governing Board of the San Ramon Valley Unified School District hereby finds, determines, declares, orders, and resolves as follows:

- 1) That the above recitals are true and correct;
- 2) That the need for contractor(s) to perform the Emergency Events Repair Work is an emergency as defined by applicable statute(s) ("Emergency");
- 3) That the Board delegates and authorizes the District's Superintendent or designee to execute a contract as appropriate to perform the Emergency Events Repair work related to the emergency, without further advertising for or inviting of bids, and to take all steps and perform all actions necessary to execute and implement those contracts;

- Title IV Part A (Student and School Support)
 - The Student Support and Academic Enrichment program under Title IV, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) is a federal categorical program contained in the Consolidated Application. These funds are intended to increase the capacity of local educational agencies (LEAs) to meet the goals of the ESSA by providing all students with access to a well-rounded education, improving school conditions for student learning, and improving use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.

SRVUSD Early Childhood Education Preschool Program

History

The California State Preschool Program was established in 1956 when legislation was passed which authorized a statewide system of preschool programs designed to provide equal educational opportunities for children whose families met certain eligibility criteria.

San Ramon Valley Unified School District applied and was granted two licenses in the spring of 2017. Our classrooms opened for the 2017-2018 school year and are housed at Live Oak Elementary and Walt Disney Elementary.

This Program is regulated by the California State Department of Social Services. SRVUSD partners with Contra Costa County to offer the program and is responsible for program administration, budget preparation and management, employment and evaluation of staff, personnel policies, and maintenance of the sites.

Our Early Childhood Education Preschool Program can serve up to 48 eligible children.

Program Mission

The San Ramon Valley Early Childhood Education Preschool Program strives to provide a positive, safe environment that addresses the social, emotional, cognitive, and physical needs of all children.

State Preschool Goal

According to the State of California, the program goal of a Child Development Program is to provide an efficient and effective early education and developmental system, as determined by community needs, offering a full range of services in a safe, healthy, and nurturing environment. There are six key dimensions:

- 1. Standards, Assessments and Accountability to ensure that all educational programs are based on high and challenging standards and are accompanied by a process for monitoring and determining effectiveness.
- 2. Teaching and Learning to ensure that all students are provided with integrated and coordinated programs based on student needs and educationally sound and legally acceptable educational practices.
- 3. Opportunity (equal educational access) to ensure that all students have equitable access to, and the opportunity to participate in and benefit from, high-quality curricular and extracurricular activities.
- 4. Staffing and Professional Growth to ensure that students have access to qualified teachers, administrators, and other staff members and that all educators have access to high-quality professional growth opportunities.
- 5. Parent and Community Involvement to ensure that parents and members of the community, including business, industry, and labor, have the opportunity to assist in and support the educational process through participation in decision making, training and volunteer activities, and the creation of partnerships.
- 6. Governance and Administration to ensure that all schools conduct high-quality programs that are effectively managed and operated within appropriate legal parameters.

Desired Results

In order to monitor child development programs in California, there are six components of the desired results structure for children and their families:

- · Children are personally and socially competent.
- · Children are effective learners.
- · Children show physical and motor competence.
- · Children are safe and healthy.
- Families support their children's learning and development.
- · Families achieve their goals.

All children are assessed using the DRDP (Desired Results Developmental Profile) within the first 60 calendar days of attendance as per Title V stipulation. These profiles are used to plan and conduct age and developmentally appropriate activities.

Admission Procedures

Admission procedures are simple, but may require some time. Parents/Guardians need to allow at least 45 minutes for an appointment. During this time the Early Childhood Education Program and Policies will be explained. Children may not be admitted until all enrollment forms are complete and immunizations are up-to-date. A Pre-Admission Health form must be completed for each student, as well as proof of a physical examination, including a TB Test, (or test as determined by your medical provider) and results signed by a doctor are required within thirty (30) days of enrollment or services provided or a child may be terminated. Parents/Guardians may also be required to provide documentation of a recent TB test if they will be volunteering in the classroom.

It is required that all children be fully potty-trained. No diapers or pull-ups are allowed in the classroom. If the child has an inability to use the restroom independently, the child may be temporarily dropped until the child is fully potty-trained.

Area Served

Eligibility for subsidized preschool services is determined by State criteria. SRVUSD Early Childhood Education Preschool Program typically provides services to residents of San Ramon, Danville, and Alamo or those employed within the SRVUSD boundaries.

Arrival and Dismissal

Parents or an authorized adult (18 years or older) must come into the building to sign children in and out each day. The California Department of Community Care Licensing requires each adult to sign in with a full, legal, legible signature. Children will not be released to adults who are not listed by the parent/guardian as emergency contacts or to persons under 18 years of age. If someone other than persons you have listed as emergency contacts will be picking up your child, it is the parent/guardian responsibility to provide notice in writing authorizing the person to pick up the child. The person will be asked to show identification upon pick-up. This is required to insure the protection of your child.

Please drop off and pick up your child on time. If you find that you are not able to arrive on time, it is your responsibility to send someone else or call in advance to let us know that you will be late.

Every parent/guardian is required to maintain two backup people who could pick up their child within 30 minutes of being contacted. If late pick up occurs in excess of three times in one year, your child may be dropped from the program.

Attendance

Our funding depends on attendance and excused absences. We need your cooperation to ensure full funding for the year. If your child is out ill, please inform your child's teacher.

Excused Absences:

- Illness or quarantine of child (including medical or mental health appointments)
- Illness or quarantine of parent (including medical or mental health appointment)
- Court ordered visitation (Court order must be on file)
- Family emergency (sibling illness, death or illness of family member)
- Best Interest of Child (See Best Interest Days below)

Best Interest Days:

Your child is allotted ten (10) Best Interest Days per school year. These are days which you can use at your own discretion, for example to take a vacation, visit with a non-custodial parent, visit relatives, religious or cultural holiday, vacation, travel, etc.

Unexcused absences:

Any absence due to a reason other than the above, or without the required verification, shall be considered an unexcused absence. Unexcused absences that exceed five (5) days in one year will affect eligibility, and may result in termination of services.

Calendar

The SRVUSD Early Education Preschool Program will follow the instructional calendar of SRVUSD for the given school year. The SRVUSD Instructional Calendar for 2022-2023 is attached to the back of this handbook.

Changes in Information on Admission Form

Parents/guardians are required to notify the Elementary School Office of any change in the information on the admission forms: Home address and telephone number, accurate, reliable up-to-date names and telephone numbers of parent substitute who can be notified and will come for your child in case of emergency. Please update these items in your Parent Portal then bring the supporting documents (for residency changes) to the front office of your school.

Clothing

- Children should be dressed in comfortable, safe, and washable clothing while at school. Play and learning often involves materials such as paint, water, and glue that may get on the children's clothing.
- Coats, jackets, sweaters, etc., should be clearly marked with the child's name to prevent loss or confusion over duplicates.
- Footwear must be safe (shoes with socks are preferable). Flip flops are not permitted.
- Clothing that children can maneuver independently in the restroom
- Children must have a change of clothing (labeled) at the preschool for days when accidents occur.

Communication

Each classroom has a resource area with a bulletin board where parents/guardians can

gather and avail themselves of resource materials, information, and notices about the center and its activities.

Families also have access to information through our school site web pages.

Confidentiality

Information provided on enrollment forms shall be kept in confidence and released only with the written consent of the parent/guardian, with the exception of access that is legally required by Community Care Licensing and the California Department of Education officials. Personal information shared with parent/teacher/administrator will be handled with professional tact and shared with other staff members on a "need-to-know" basis. This includes medical history, family status, financial information, and other personal data.

Discipline

It is important that all children gain the necessary skills to behave in a socially acceptable manner, solve their own problems and develop a high sense of self- esteem through their interactions with children and adults in our environment. We do not use corporal punishment of any kind.

Disaster and Emergency Procedures

There will be regular fire, disaster, and earthquake drills to familiarize students with proper drill procedures. A detailed evacuation plan is reviewed annually and can be viewed at the front office or on the school website. Each classroom is equipped with emergency backpacks and first aid kits. In the case of an actual emergency, children will remain at school unless it must be evacuated, which is only attempted when there is no alternative. Parents/guardians will be notified of emergencies via Catapult Connect or the current communication tool used by the district. Parents/guardians must ensure that the emergency phone number contact information given to the school office is accurate and up to date.

***All students must be signed out with their child's teacher or school designee by an adult (someone listed on the school's emergency card). Students will not be allowed to walk home.

Emergencies

In case of an accident, every attempt will be made to reach a child's parents/guardian. If a parent or guardian cannot be reached,"911" may be called and the child will be taken to a hospital emergency room for immediate attention. Continued efforts will be made to reach parents/guardians and emergency contacts. In life threatening incidents, "911" will be called. If a trip to the emergency room is required, a staff member will stay with the child until a parent/designated parent substitute arrives at the hospital.

Eligibility

Eligibility is determined and certified after completion of the Confidential Application of Child Development Services and Certification of Eligibility, submission of income verification, and submission of all registration materials. Eligibility is based upon documentation and verification of at least one to the following: Income, Current Aid Recipient, Homelessness, Child Protective Services, or At Risk of Abuse, Neglect, and /or Exploitation. Admission priorities have been established based on the Funding Terms and Conditions of the contract with the California Department of Education. To qualify, families must meet eligibility requirements and the term of certification is good for at least one program year, as long as the child remains enrolled. Families must report within 30 days if their monthly income exceeds 85% of the State Median Income (SMI). This program is operated on a nondiscriminatory basis, giving equal access to services. The program does not discriminate on the basis of sex, sexual orientation, gender, ethnic group identification, race ancestry, national origin, religion, color, or mental or physical disability. The program welcomes the enrollment of children with disabilities. Children will be accepted and retained after enrollment if it is determined that the preschool is able to meet the individual needs of the child. The program understands that the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) are to make reasonable accommodations for students.

Field Trips

Onsite field trips may be scheduled throughout the year. These experiences are designed to supplement different aspects of the classroom curriculum. Parents/guardians will be notified and asked to participate, as necessary. All field trips will be properly supervised in accordance with the current licensing child/adult ratio.

Food from Home

Snacks are provided every day. Please let your child's teacher know if your child has dietary restrictions. Sharing of food is not permitted. Please do not send food with nuts or nut products, we are a nut- free school.

Hours of Operation

All State Preschool Classes are held Monday through Friday for a minimum of three (3) hours. The hours for the upcoming school year are listed below.

Illness

Health checks have always been a routine part of childcare, but are now more important than ever due to the pandemic. All children and staff must be in good health each day when they arrive at school. Children who are ill will not be allowed to enter the classroom.

Please do not send your child to school if he/she has a fever (100 degrees or higher) or has vomited in the 24 hours preceding the start of school. Children should be feeling well and free of fever for 24 hours or more before returning to school. Should your child become ill at school, we must have emergency names and contact information for individuals who can pick up your child in case you are not able to come.

If your child develops a contagious illness, parents should notify the school so that other families can be notified of possible exposure to infection. Participating program children and their parents/guardians confirmed with infectious illness or disease may be

quarantined from the program until cleared by physician's release.

Masks

At this time, masks are not mandatory, but as guidance changes, SRVUSD reserves the right to amend this policy.

Medication

If possible, medicines should be administered at home before or after school. But, if medication is needed at school, a " **Medication at School**" form MUST be completed.

- -The parent/guardian fills out a Medication Request form, **signed by both the parent/guardian and the physician** to be kept on file in the office.
- Prescription medications must be sent to the school office in the original prescription container, which includes the child's name and dosage/frequency.
- -A medication log is used to document medication administration and is available to parents upon request. Students should not keep medicine in their possession. This includes all over-the-counter medication.

Non-Discrimination Policy

SRVUSD does not discriminate on the basis of gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, race, national origin, religion, mental or physical disability. We welcome the enrollment of children with disabilities and understand the requirement of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to make reasonable accommodations and implement those accommodations for such children.

Nutrition

A daily snack will be provided to all children during preschool hours at no cost. Snacks are nutritionally balanced according to federal standards.

A variety of hot lunches are also offered each day for the students. For the 2022-23 school year, meals will be offered to all students free of charge as part of the National School Lunch Program. Parents/guardians are responsible for supervising their children in the lunchroom if they choose to eat lunch. A child must finish prior to entering the preschool classroom. Students cannot eat lunch in the classroom. For further questions

contact your school site office.

Families are encouraged to fill out the Education Benefit Form (Meal Application) found on the Child Nutrition page of the SRVUSD website.

Parent/Guardian Teacher Conferences

Parent-Teacher conferences are held twice a year. During this time, parents and teachers have a chance to discuss the child's development and work together toward defining specific goals for the child. Conferences are an opportunity for parents to share insights about a child at home while finding out more about how he/she is doing at school. More frequent conferences may be arranged if necessary.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

All parents/guardians with a child in the program must agree to the following:

- Report any changes in status within 10 days to the front office at the school site
- Follow the late pick up policy. If a child is not picked up within 15 minutes of dismissal they will be brought to the school office. Children may be dropped from the program if they are picked up 15 or more minutes after the designated time, three (3) times during the year. Our Late Child Notice/Late Child Procedure will be utilized in such cases. (Appendix C)
- Obtain immunizations in a timely manner and follow the health policies
- Notify your student's teacher with the reason for a child's absence and bring a doctor's note, if required for (3) or more consecutive days of absences or certain illnesses.
- Sign the child in and out daily using a full signature
- Provide written permission if an adult (over 18 years old) other than the persons listed on the emergency form is to pick up the child. Persons picking up children who are not on the emergency card must be prepared to show identification.
- Attend an orientation which includes a review of the school handbook prior to attendance
- Agree to abide with regulations and policies as stated in this parent manual

Parent/Guardian Involvement

Parents and guardians of students participating in the preschool program are encouraged to participate in Parent Education events and become involved in the School Site Council at their child's school of enrollment. We believe that involvement by families increases a student's opportunity for success.

We encourage parents to talk to the teachers on a regular basis. Open communication is valued and encouraged. Our Parent Orientation is an opportunity to visit the child's classroom and meet the teacher.

Parents' and Personal Rights

Upon the child's enrollment in the program, parents are given copies of Parent Rights and Personal Rights (issued by the Community Care Licensing). They are also included in the Handbook appendix A & B. Parent and guardians have the right to be informed of the appropriate licensing agency to contact regarding complaints. Program Evaluation

Our California State Preschool Program maintains high quality, developmentally appropriate environments that meet or exceed standards set by the State of California. By using a variety of tools to evaluate our program, we continually look for ways to improve. These tools include self-evaluation through the Environmental Rating Scale (ECRS), curriculum, staff development, parent engagement, and satisfaction of our families. We are licensed by the California Department of Social Services and undergo periodic inspection to ensure continual compliance with all regulations.

Religious Instruction or Worship

SRVUSD shall refrain from all religious instruction or worship. At no time will families be discriminated against because of religious affiliation or family worship practices.

Sunscreen

We suggest that you apply sunscreen (broad spectrum SPF 15 or higher) before dropping your child at school. If you request staff to apply sunscreen to your child, the appropriate form must be completed as sunscreen is considered a non-prescription medication and requires a special consent form.

Termination of Enrollment

Every effort will be made to keep students enrolled in our program. However, in accordance with our policies, enrollment may be terminated for the following reasons:

- The school experience is too stressful for an individual child
- The child's behavior is having an adverse effect on other children
- The child's behavior is an endangerment to staff
- The child is picked up 15 or more minutes after the designated time, three (3)
 times during the year
- The family fails to comply with the health and safety policies
- The child has 5 or more unexcused absences
- The family fails to maintain eligibility requirements
- The family fails to provide a completed physical for the child(ren) within thirty days of enrollment
- The parent or family representative is verbally or physically abusive to the staff or children
- The family repeatedly fails to sign in/out with full signature at the time of drop off
- The family knowingly uses incorrect or inaccurate information to obtain a benefit that they otherwise would not be entitled to receive
- Failure to keep immunizations current
- The center determines that it is unable to meet the needs of the child

Toys and Games from Home

Toys and games from home are not allowed at school unless specifically requested by the teacher. Items are too easily lost or broken and young children often find it difficult to share a personal or much loved toy.

Transportation

Transportation is not provided by SRVUSD to or from preschool sites.

Visitors

SRVUSD Early Childhood Education Preschool Program supports and encourages parents/guardians, community members, and fellow educators to visit and/or observe at our program. Prior notification of intent to visit for any reason is appreciated. Visitors must sign in at the school office upon arrival and wear a visitor's badge before proceeding to the classroom. Visitors may be required to show photo identification. Parents/guardians are encouraged to participate in activities that enhance social well-being and community.

Volunteers

We welcome and encourage family members to volunteer in our classrooms! In order to ensure the safety of our children, all prospective volunteers must:

- 2. Provide proof of a negative TB test

Check with your teacher for volunteer opportunities in your child's classroom.

- 5. Request in writing that a parent not be allowed to visit your child or take your child from the child care center, provided you have shown a certified copy of a court order.

- 7. Be informed by the licensee, upon request, of the name and type of association to the child care center for any adult who has been granted a criminal record exemption, and that the name of the person may also be obtained by contacting the local licensing office.
- 8. Receive, from the licensee, the Caregiver Background Check Process form.

NOTE: CALIFORNIA STATE LAW PROVIDES THAT THE LICENSEE MAY DENY ACCESS TO THE CHILD CARE CENTER TO A PARENT/AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IF THE BEHAVIOR OF THE PARENT/AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE POSES A RISK TO CHILDREN IN CARE.

PERSONAL RIGHTS

Child Care Centers

Personal Rights, See Section 101223 for waiver conditions applicable to Child Care Centers.

- (a) Child Care Centers. Each child receiving services from a Child Care Center shall have rights which include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - (1) To be accorded dignity in his/her personal relationships with staff and other persons.
 - (2) To be accorded safe, healthful and comfortable accommodations, furnishings and equipment to meet his/her needs.
 - (3) To be free from corporal or unusual punishment, infliction of pain, humiliation, intimidation, ridicule, coercion, threat, mental abuse, or other actions of a punitive nature, including but not limited to: interference with daily living functions, including eating, sleeping, or toileting; or withholding of shelter, clothing, medication or aids to physical functioning.
 - (4) To be informed, and to have his/her authorized representative, if any, informed by the licensee of the provisions of law regarding complaints including, but not limited to, the address and telephone number of the complaint receiving unit of the licensing agency and of information regarding confidentiality.
 - (5) To be free to attend religious services or activities of his/her choice and to have visits from the spiritual advisor of his/her choice. Attendance at religious services, either in or outside the facility, shall be on a completely voluntary basis. In Child Care Centers, decisions concerning attendance at religious services or visits from spiritual advisors shall be made by the parent(s), or guardian(s) of the child.
 - (6) Not to be locked in any room, building, or facility premises by day or night.
 - (7) Not to be placed in any restraining device, except a supportive restraint approved in advance by the licensing agency.

TOPIC: CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF REVISED JOB DESCRIPTIONS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND BUSINESS SERVICES MANAGEMENT POSITIONS

DISCUSSION: Following the recent retirement of our Assistant Director of Assessment, Research and Evaluation, staff reassessed the needs of the District and the Educational Services Department with respect to the position and determined that the job responsibilities needed revision to best serve our school sites. The revisions made to the job description warrant an upgrade of the position to Director I retroactive to the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year.

Additionally, with the pending departure of the District's Chief Business Officer, staff has determined the need to revise the job description to more accurately reflect the needs of the District and the responsibilities of the position and to assign a new title - Assistant Superintendent, Business Operations - to it. As was true of the Chief Business Officer position, the Assistant Superintendent of Business Operations will be an executive leadership position, will be employed under an individual employment contract, will be compensated based upon the existing Assistant Superintendent's salary schedule, and will be designated a senior management position in the District's classified service.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the attached, revised job descriptions be approved as presented.

BUDGET IMPLICATION: It is estimated that the cost to the District of upgrading the position of Assistant Director to Director will be approximately \$21,000 per year. There is no cost to the District associated with the development of the Assistant Superintendent, Business Operations position.
