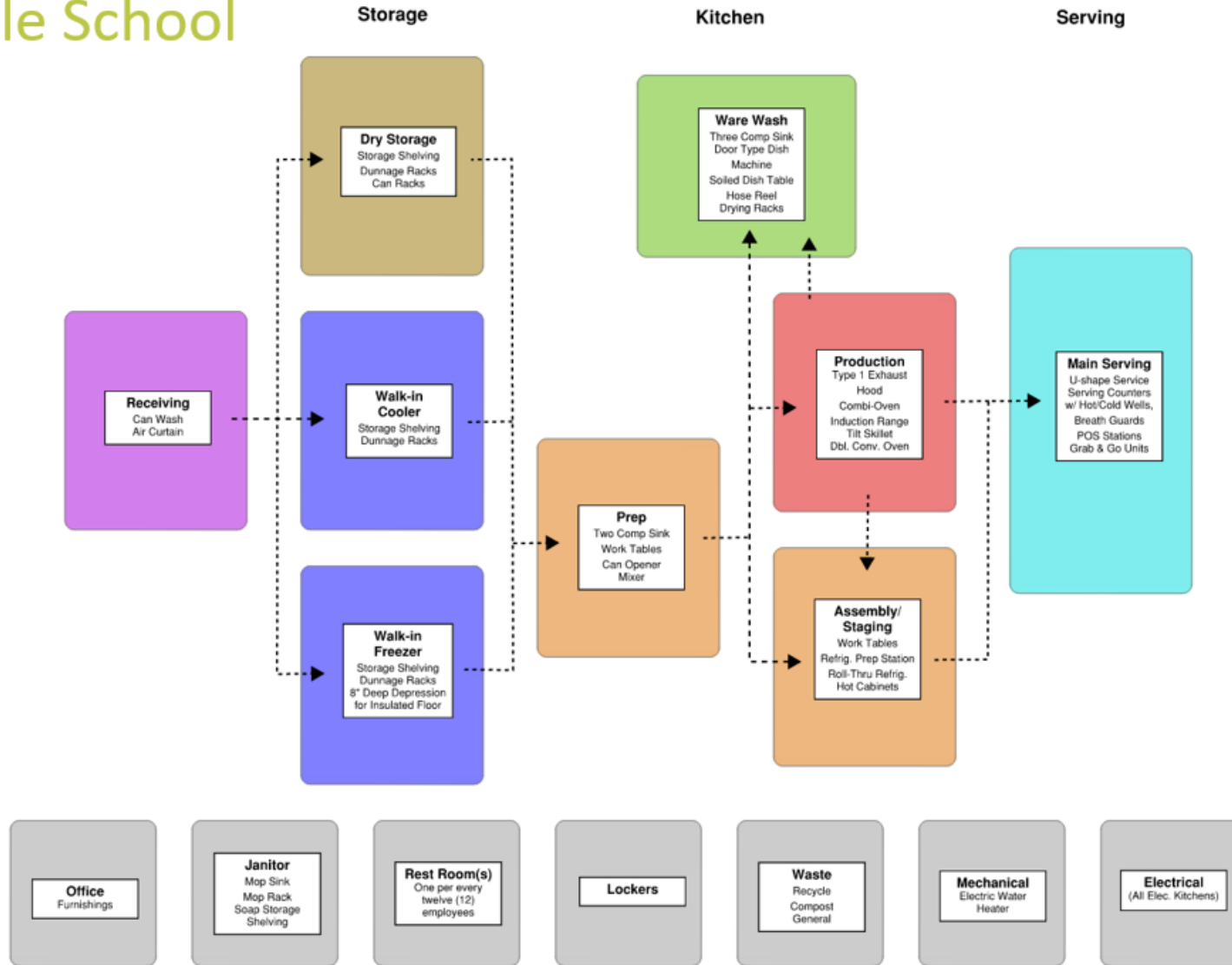

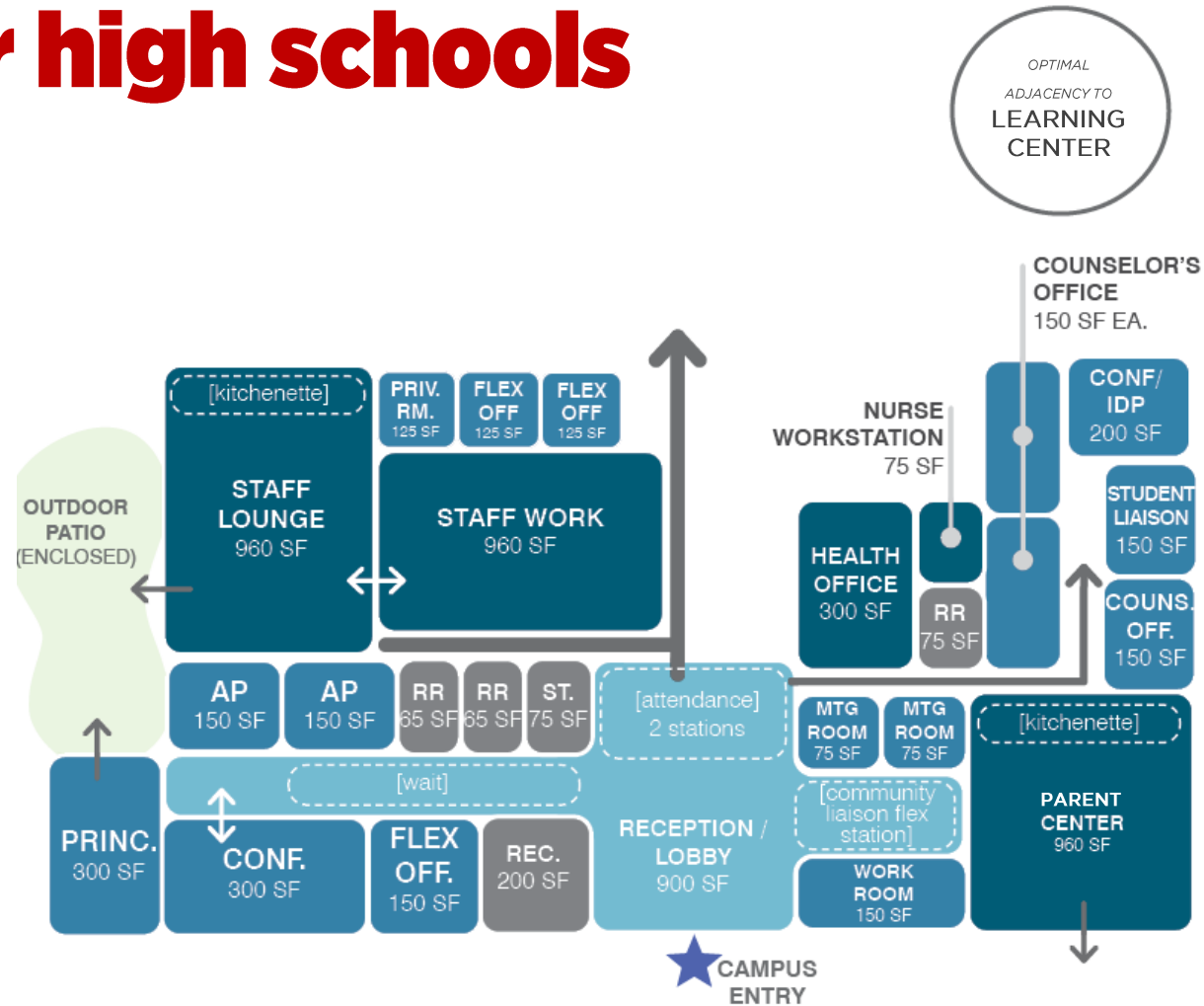

### WELCOMING TO THE COMMUNITY

- Expand the Admin into a Welcome Center as a controlled point of entry with perimeter fencing.
- Expand the Admin to have a welcoming waiting area and conference rooms.
- Provide Flex spaces for dedicated community and after school program use to transform the campus into a community hub.

### OPTIMIZING THE OUTDOORS

- Provide more outdoor learning areas optimized with furniture to support collaboration, space for project-based learning, and shade opportunities.
- Provide shade structures and trees to create places at different scales for social interaction and respite.
- Develop the garden on the east to become a purposeful learning environment.

### INDOOR LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

- Provide breakout rooms for student pull out support need to be distributed throughout the campus.
- Provide a Flex Lab for after school programs and to serve as a Makerspace in the daytime
- Provide dedicated space for all specialized curriculums that is supported by proper equipment and infrastructure, i.e. Art, Music and Tech Lab.
- Do a modernization of the Learning Center (used to be a Tech Lab) for all resource specialist and interventionist enriched programs. Needs to be zoned with partition walls and the right furniture to create the zones needed.
- Ensure all TK/K environments have proper infrastructure.

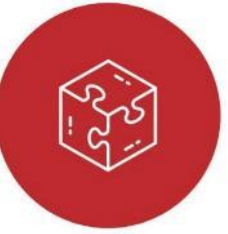
