Committee Overview

- Proposition 39 (passed Nov 2000) requires school districts have a citizens committee to actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction and to inform the public concerning the expenditure of bond revenues..
- The committee shall have at least 7 members and meet at least once per year.
- The committee is required to issue a report to the public at least once a year.

Measure D Overview

- Passed November 2012 by voters living within district boundaries.
- Authorized \$260 million in bonds to be used for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or replacement of school facilities.
 - All bonds have been issued as of June 2019.
- Cumulative expenditures through June 30, 2019 \$182.2 million
 - Through June 30, 2020 \$213.7 million (unaudited)

Audit and Reporting

- The Measure D financial activities are audited annually.
- The audit for the 12 months ended June 30, 2019 was performed by the independent accounting firm Eide Bailly LLP.

- The audit firm provided an unqualified opinion dated March 9, 2019.

Audit and Reporting

- The FOAC was scheduled to discuss and approve the audit at a meeting scheduled for March 11, 2020 and planned to provide our annual report to the SRVUSD Board in the May-June timeframe.
- The March 11 meeting was cancelled as FOAC members, district staff and SRVUSD Board liaisons were facing various COVID-19 pandemic responses.
- The FOAC reviewed and approved the audit report at its May 20, 2020 meeting.
- Presentation of this annual report was deferred until such time as it could be appropriately presented at a Board meeting given ongoing pandemic. For the June 30, 2020 year the FOAC anticipates a return to a more traditional reporting schedule.

- San Ramon interior design, exterior fencing, parking areas and overall project progress
- Cal High preliminary planning for kitchen upgrade and expansion
