INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT

DISCUSSION:

Twice a year, the District must prepare an interim report, which indicates whether the District will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent years. This report, prepared with information through October 31, 2020, includes the following components discussed below: ADA, financial statements for all funds, cash flow, multi-year projection and District Certification.

Average Daily Attendance

Estimate P-2 ADA of 28,929.42 is down from the 30,929.42 Budget Adoption estimate but the district will be funded based on the 2019-20 P-2 ADA of 30,948.61.

General Fund

The General Fund Budget presented under the Board Approved Operating Budget (column B) reflects budget revisions approved as of October 31, 2020. The Projected Year Totals (column D) reflects subsequent budget adjustments and projections. Major adjustments since budget adoption include recognition of changes in state and local revenues and receipt of new federal Learning Loss Mitigation grants. Salaries and benefits have been adjusted to reflect updated projections and all expenditure categories have been adjusted for the budgeting of prior year carryover. The combined beginning balance of \$43,649,949.20 reflects the closing balances from the 2019-20 Unaudited Actuals Report. The projected ending fund balance for June 30, 2021 is \$33,214,574.20.

Other Funds

The beginning balances in all funds have been adjusted to equal the 2019-20 Unaudited Actuals ending fund balances.

Cash Flow

The District will maintain a positive cash balance through the end of the 2020-21 fiscal year.

Multi Year Projection

The projection assumes an enrollment increase of 725 students in 2021-22, reflecting the return to full in-person learning. The projection assumes a decline of 275 students in 2022-23. Overall, the average decline per year in 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 remains the Board's June 2020 enrollment assumption of "-275" students per year. Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), Costs of Living Adjustment (COLA), and Consumer Price Index (CPI) factors are aligned to the current School Service of California Financial Projection Dartboard. Medical costs are projected to increase 8.00% annually with no increase for Dental or Vision. Cash in lieu of health and welfare is capped at the current level. Benefit costs reflect STRS and PERS required pension contribution rate increases. Under this set of assumptions, the District has a positive balance of \$17,754,904.16 in unrestricted reserves for use in future years to cover projected deficit spending.

SCHOOL PROGRAM

DISCUSSION: The 2021 summer school programs will be offered Monday – Friday available for certain student groups:

- Extended School Year (ESY): Our Extended School Year program will continue for students who are eligible for ESY through their existing Individualized Education Programs (IEP).
- English Language Learner classes: Remote learning opportunities will continue to be offered to English language learners.
- Intervention classes: A series of intervention classes in Math and English Language Arts for students going into grades 1-5 next year will be offered. Students will be referred for participation by teachers and school sites based on assessment data.
- Middle School Bridge Program: Math Bridge courses will be available for current Course 1 and Course 2 students through Edgenuity, the District online summer program.
- Remediation classes: Remediation summer school will be offered for students who have failed a course. Students in grades 6-11 who receive D's will be admitted only if space is available as first priority is given to students who have failed. School counselors will recommend students for remediation summer school. The courses include (pending enrollment): English 9, 10, 11, World Geography, World History, U.S. History, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Biology, and Chemistry.
- High School Graduation Requirements: Classes will be offered to current grade 12 only students who need to remediate a course in a virtual classroom setting in order to complete graduation requirements and receive a diploma. The courses include (pending enrollment): English 12, Economics and, Government.

RECOMMENDATION: Administration recommends a summer school program for 2021.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS: Based on 2020 summer school enrollment, projected budget costs for 2021 would be approximately \$350-\$400K




School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue San Ramon Valley USD expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for San Ramon Valley USD is \$371,852,336.00, of which \$274,524,323.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$50,028,755.00 is other state funds, \$30,281,818.00 is local funds, and \$17,017,440.00 is federal funds. Of the \$17,017,440.00 in federal funds, \$9,825,167.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$274,524,323.00 in LCFF Funds, \$5,190,810.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much San Ramon Valley USD plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

San Ramon Valley USD plans to spend \$379,158,339.00 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$11,772,649.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$367,385,690.00 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

As a general rule, 85% (+/-) of total General Fund expenditures consist of personnel salaries and benefits. These costs account for the human resources required to carry out a vast array of basic educational and support activities such as classroom teaching, clerical support, transportation, custodial activities, health and safety, building maintenance and operation, and more. These activities along with the related supplies and services costs do not directly influence the outcome of the specific actions and services identified in the Learning Continuity Plan (LCP) and Local Contraol Accountability Plan (LCAP). For these reasons, they are not generally included in the LCP and LCAP unless specifically identified.



Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity
Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, San Ramon Valley USD is projecting it will receive \$5,190,810.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. San Ramon Valley USD must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. San Ramon Valley USD plans to spend \$323,000.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

For 2020-21 school year, San Ramon Valley USD is projecting receipt of \$5,190,810 in Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) Supplemental and Concentration dollars. These dollars are generated by the District's (1) English learners, (2) income eligible for free or reduced-price meals, and (3) foster youth pupils collectively known as the District's "unduplicated pupil percentage". As part of both the 2017-20 Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) and the 2020-21 Learning Continuity Plan (LCP), the District describes how these dollars are invested in increasing and improving educational services for high needs students in the unduplicated categories. On top of investing \$5+ million in annual LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars, the District is investing at least \$323,000 additional dollars for high needs students as described in the LCP. The dollars for high needs students described in the LCP are less than the projected LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars for 2020-2021. This difference results from dollars outlined in the LCP representing only expenses charged to ESSER Funds (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief), Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF), and Governor's Emergency Education Fund (GEER). Collectively, these funds are known as "Learning Loss Mitigation" and "CARES Act" dollars. The District's LCP investments specifically for high needs students include (1) additional Social Workers and (2) additional English Learner Para-Educators across all Elementary Schools. LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars not discussed in the LCP are included in the District's 2020-21 First Interim report scheduled for approval by the School Board on December 15, 2020. Additional information about how the District utilizes LCFF dollars to increase and improve services for high needs students is detailed in the District's 2017-20 Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) posted to the District's website.

Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what San Ramon Valley USD budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what San Ramon Valley USD actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, San Ramon Valley USD's LCAP budgeted \$6,101,596.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. San Ramon Valley USD actually spent \$5,285,733.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020. The difference between the budgeted and actual expenditures of \$815,863.00 had the following impact on San Ramon Valley USD's ability to increase or improve services for high needs students:

In 2019-20, District's LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars included \$6,101,596 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. The final/actual amount invested last year was \$5,285,733. The \$815,863 in remaining LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars carry forward into 2020-21 and beyond specifically designated for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. As we all know all too well, the COVID-19 Pandemic caused almost all districts to move into virtual distance learning models starting in March 2020 which continued through the June 2020 end of last school year. The inability to provide in-person supports and resources for students, staff and families played a role in generating the \$815,863 difference between the 2019-20 budgeted and actual LCFF Supplemental/Concentration investments. The \$5+ million that was invested in high needs students' services included (1) anti-bullying, restorative justice and Sanford Harmony training and social emotional curriculum at all elementary schools, (2) Increase TK-12 mental health counselors, including piloting wellness centers at two comprehensive high schools, (3) TK-12 intervention training and professional development, (4) Tk-12 culturally responsive teaching and learning programs, (5) remedial and enrichment summer school, (6) increasing social workers, and (7) increasing high school librarians. Additional information on how the District utilized 2019-2020 LCFF Supplemental/Concentration dollars to increase or improve services for high needs students is detailed in LCAP posted to the District's website.

WHEREAS, the San Ramon Valley Unified School District ("District") has received and expended reportable capital school facilities fees paid on new commercial and industrial construction, new residential construction and other residential construction as authorized pursuant to Education Code section 17620, et. seq. and Government Code section 65995, et. seq. ("Developer Fees"); and

WHEREAS, said Developer Fees have been deposited in a separate capital facilities account ("Capital Facilities Fund") pursuant to Government Code section 66006, subdivision (a), in a manner to avoid commingling of Developer Fees with other revenues and funds of the District, except for temporary investments; and

WHEREAS, said Developer Fees expended for the sole purpose for which they were collected; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 66006, subdivision (b)(1), provides that the District shall, within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year, make available to the public the following information regarding Developer Fees for the fiscal year:

- A. A brief description of the type of fee in the account or fund;
- B. The amount of the fee:
- C. The beginning and ending balance of the account or fund;
- D. The amount of the fees collected and the interest earned;
- E. An identification of each public improvement on which fees were expended and the amount of the expenditures on each improvement, including the total percentage of the cost of the public improvement that was funded with the fees;
- F. An identification of an approximate date by which the construction of the public improvement will commence if the local agency determines that sufficient funds have been collected to complete financing on an incomplete public improvement, as identified in Government Code section 66001, subdivision (a)(2), and the public improvement remains incomplete;
- G. A description of each interfund transfer or loan made from the account or fund, including the public improvement on which the transferred or loaned fees will be expended, and, in the case of an interfund loan, the date on which the loan will be repaid, and the rate of interest that the account or fund will receive on the loan; and
- H. The amounts of refund made pursuant to Government Code section 66001, subdivision (f); and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 66001, subdivision (d), provides that for the fifth fiscal year following the first deposit into the account or fund of Developer Fees, and every five years thereafter, the District shall make all of the following findings with respect to that portion of the account or fund remaining unexpended, whether committed or uncommitted:

- A. Identify the purpose to which the fee is to be put;
- B. Demonstrate a reasonable relationship between the fee and the purpose for which it is charged;
- C. Identify all sources and amounts of funding anticipated to complete financing in incomplete improvements identified in Government Code section 66001, subdivision (a)(2); and
- D. Designate the approximate dates on which the funding referred to in Government code section 66001, subdivision (d)(1) (C), is excepted to be deposited into the appropriate account or fund; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 66001, subdivision (e), except as otherwise provided by law, when sufficient funds have been collected, as determined pursuant to Government Code section 66006, subdivision (b)(1)(F), to complete financing on an incomplete public improvement identified in Government Code section 66001, subdivision (a)(2), and the public improvements remain incomplete, the District must identify, within 180 days of the determination that sufficient funds have been collected, an appropriate date by which the construction of the public improvements will be commenced, or must refund to the then current record owner or owners of the lots or units, as identified on the last equalized assessment role, of the development project or projects on a prorated basis, the unexpended portion of the fee, and any interest accrued thereon; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 66001, subdivision (d), those findings required by that section must be made in connection with the public information required by Government Code section 66006, subdivision (b); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 66006, subdivision (b)(2) provides that the District must review the information made available to the public pursuant to Section 66006 at a regularly scheduled public meeting occurring not less than 15 days after the information is made public; and

WHEREAS, that information required by Government Code sections 66001 and 66006, including but not limited to a report entitled the Developer Fee Report ("Public Report"), was made available to the public on or before November 30, 2020, 15 days prior to the regularly scheduled public meeting held on December 15, 2020 before the Governing Board of the San Ramon Valley Unified School District ("Board"); and

WHEREAS, notice of the availability of the Public Report was provided on or before November 30, 2020 to the extent required by Government Code section 66006, subdivision (b)(2); and

WHEREAS, the Public Report was presented to the Board at its duly noticed public meeting of December 15, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of the San Ramon Valley Unified School District receives, incorporates by reference, approves and adopts the Public Report;
